'Sentimentality' criticized in economic decision-making

Economist's economist Abba Lerner criticized "sentimentality" in economic decision-making Thursday night before a half-empty auditorium. "Freedom, bribery and corruption all are words for a society whose priorities are determined individually on markets," said the SCONA speaker. The difference in these words is not in their meaning but in their sentimental value, he added.

He noted that the largest grouping, the multi-national corporation, is under fire from sources which include the United Nations. "People (at a special UN conference) automatically decided these businesses were bad things. Some bad things are caused by multi-nationals, but the bad things can be prevented. One wonders of

the UN wants these companies with larger budget than some of its members to join pay dues and send their labor force out to quell international difficulties. "Businesses have no social responsibilities. Their part is to make money and be taxed so the representative government can redistribute it fairly," Lerner said.
