That was the prediction when ndergraduate girls were admitted to the school in 1963 and the Corps was made completely noncompulsory in 1965. The size of the Corps has continually declined since then but it remains a unique institution and a potent influence on campus.

Col. Thomas R. Parsons, commandant of the Corps, was a junior at the time the freshmen were moved to the old Bryan airfield in 1947. "I remember distinctly," said Parsons, "our reaction was that the Corps was finished . . . ruined forever. Sure enough, we became stronger because of it. It
