

## Doctor's Door

CLAUDE GOSWICK, MD, University Health Center, answers students questions.

Q. What are the effects of prolonged lack of sleep?

A. Sleep is absolutely essential; and, of the conditions making for human efficiency, it is one of the most important.

Human experimental subjects have been deprived of sleep for more than 200 hours. On simple tests, the subjects did fairly well. But on tests requiring longer attention span they became slow and inaccurate. They were unable to shift attention from one test to another. Symptoms are: burning eyes, headaches, nervousness, emotional instability (irritability or silliness), loss of motor power and coordination, slurred speech. and even visual hallucinations.

Although most students will never approach these extremes, the symptoms must be familiar to a certain extent to almost everyone.

Q. What is the Rh factor and why is it important in pregnancies?

A. The Rh factor is the most complex of several human blood group systems. Females who lack this factor (Rh negative) may become immunized (develop antibodies) when, during pregnancy, the blood of a fetus enters their

systems. In turn, the mother's blood may destroy (hemolyze) the blood of the fetus.

This factor can be a problem with the first pregnancy, but it is usually with succeeding pregnancies that serious results may

Q. Is amnesia truth or a myth? The term amnesia means loss of ability to form memories despite an alert state of mind. Two types of amnesia are seen occasionally: that which follows a concussion and that associated with hysteria.

Post-concussion amnesia is short-lived (a matter of minutes or hours), and hysterial amnesia may last several days. Post-concussion amnesia is self diminishing, while hysterial amnesia may be treated with psychotherapy or hypnosis.

Neither of these is permanent, so permanent amnesia is largely

a myth. However, memories may be permanently lost if brain cells themselves are damaged, as in an auto accident, or during surg-
