

Election filing ends

Filing for spring elections closed Thursday with only four unfiled positions and approximately 12 positions unopposed.

The situation has changed drastically in three days time, with 58 positions unfiled for and 33 running unopposed late Monday.

Positions with no candidates are graduate spots in the College of Agriculture and Engineering in the Student Senate, and representatives for agriculture and veterinary medicine in the Graduate Student Council.
