The Philosophy Department has three courses dealing with the use of the library. Dr. Henry L. Almsmeier Jr. teaches Library and Learning (Hum. 101) which is concerned with a general orientation of the library and reference works.

Use of the Library (Hum. 311) teaches the student to research in his own major. A similar course (Hum. 611) is geared for graduate students.

Introduction to Business (Mgmt. 105) provides a general overview of business and its role in contemporary society. Business organization, governmental regulations, accounting, marketing, small business operations and data processing are covered in the class, said Foster C. Rinefort, Jr., instructor of the course.

The College of Geosciences offers general survey courses in oceanography and meteorology. Introduction to Ocean Studies (Ocn. 205) is to acquaint students with the problems facing society regarding the resources and potential of the oceans, said Dr. Thomas Spence, course instructor. The one-credit class is technical only to the point necessary to explain the topics covered.

Weather and Climate (Met. 203) is a non-mathematical, one-

credit class concerning the strange ways of the weather. "This much talked about yet little understood subject has some fascination for the average person," instructor Dr. Horace R. Byers said.

Dr. Ronald Schorn, who proved there is water on Mars, teaches two astronomy courses. Descriptive Astronomy (Phys. 306) and Survey of Astronomy (Phys. 314) have occasional evening constellation and telescope sessions.

"When a student gets through the course, he will know that astronomy is not magical by knowing just how we find out about our universe. He'll be less likely to confuse Venus as a flying saucer," commented Dr. Schorn.

Organic Evolution (Biol. 337) is a two-hour course covering general evolution of new species, fossil and modern man. "We wish to present the theories of evolution along with facts in such an open and unprejudiced way as to exemplify objective thinking at its best," said instructor Dr. L. S. Dillon.

The current catalog should be checked before registering in any of these. Most have no prerequisites but none of these courses are guaranteed to be "cush" classes.

tapes of conversations held in mid-April 1973.

The committee is demanding tapes of a total of 36 conversations in April 1973 and six that took place in February and March of that year.

The tapes St. Clair offered to

turn over cover conversations the President had with H. R. Haldeeman, John D. Ehrlichman and John W. Dean III between Feb. 20 and March 30, 1973. In each case, in its letter of Feb. 25, 1974, the committee staff was able to request a specific conversation believed to have concerned Watergate.

Stonehenge movie

A full length feature film, "The Mystery of Stonehenge," will be shown free to all interested students April 16 at 7:30 p.m. in room 701 of the Rudder Tower. The color movie, produced in 1965 by CBS, presents an account of Stonehenge, a prehistoric stone monument in England. It investi-

gates the theories as to how and when it was built and tests the idea that Stonehenge served as an observatory for determining astronomical calculations. Only one showing of the film will be made. It is being sponsored by the Sociology and Anthropology Department.

Meats team honors

The Texas A&M Junior Meats Judging Team returned from Sioux City, South Dakota, Monday, after winning top honors at the Great Plains Invitational Meats Judging Contest. Two teams, consisting of four individuals each, with one alternate, com-

peted against 22 teams representing ten other schools from around the nation. The Team, with a record of two wins, no losses, hopes to travel to Knoxville the weekend of April 20, for a final contest.
