Hoover in SWC tennis final

Aggies singles star upsets seeded competition

HOUSTON-Aggie Bill Hoover defied prediction in making mincemeat of the seeded competition and advanced to the finals of the SWC tennis tournament.

Unseeded Hoover advanced to the quarterfinals by defeating third-seeded Lee Merry of Houston on Monday.

In the quarters, Hoover defeated Texas' Dan Nelson, 6-4, 4-6, 7-5.

On Saturday Nelson beat gathered steam and won the final A&M's Dan Courson in the top bout of the SWC dual match at A&M.

Hoover in the semi-final match, disposed of Rice's Alan Boss in a 34-game split set match, 5-7, 7-5, 6-4. Exactly half of the 34 games were service breaks. Boss had a chance to win the match with two match points in

the second set before losing.

Boss trailed in the first set, 1-5, but came back to win 7-5. Hoover

Hardie is the defending singles champion and is 16-2 on the season with one of those losses coming to eliminated second seed Walker.

Hoover beat Hardie as a freshman but lost last year.

with Merry, Smith said, "Bill just kept the pressure on and cooked him."


"We're real proud of Hoover, he's the first singles finalist we've had since Richard Barker (now Aggie assistant coach) in 1964."
