Cindermen travel to Drake Relays

High hurdles, mile relay highlight Aggie weekend hopes

While much of the track squad is healing from various injuries, coaches Charles Thomas and Ted Nelson take a 15-man unit to the Drake Relays in Des Moines this weekend.

Sprinters Sam Dierschke, Charles Dawson and Gerald D'Ambrosio will stay home to nurse sore legs, thereby negating any chance for an Aggie entry in the 440-yard relay.

The mile relay team of Harold Davis, Horace Grant, Craig McPhail and Doug Broadhead sped to

their season's best time last week at Kansas with a 3:11.6 in the preliminaries. They finished third in the finals with a rain-slowed time of 3:15.1.

Ron McGonigle, Shifton Baker, Adolph Tingan and Pat Bradley form the distance medley relay team for A&M with McGonigle running the opening leg of 880 yards. McGonigle has been thwarted in running a good half-mile in the first two major meets this year as the two-mile relay team was scratched at the Texas Relays two weeks

ago and he lost his shoe in the first turn of his leg of the two-mile relay at the Kansas Relays Saturday. Baker will run the second leg of 440 yards. Although he anchored the mile relay team for Elgin High School last year, Baker has not had many opportunities to run the quarter this year as he has been mainly confined to the hurdles. Tingan will run the 1320-yard leg while Bradley will anchor with the mile.

Scottie Jones will be the Aggies' top individual entry and should be well remembered by Drake fans as he holds part of the Relays' record of 13.5 in the 120-yard high hurdles. Jones ran a 13.6 last week at Kansas and could rewrite the record book again this year with a good performance. Baker is also entered with a best time of 14.1.

Bill Newton could be one of the top competitors in the javelin if he is completely recovered from a knee injury suffered a month ago. Newton was throwing around 220 feet before hurting his knee in a non-track related injury and has not been over 210 since.

Tom Owen will be attempting a comeback in the long jump after pulling a hamstring at LSU April 6. This will be Owen's first appearance since his injury but his best of 24-5 1/2 is still the third best mark in the conference.

Don Riggs will be the sole Aggie entry in the high jump as Phil McGuire will stay home to interview for Vet school. Riggs has a best of 6-8 this year, a mark he has achieved several times. Success at greater heights has managed to elude him as he learns the mechanics of "flopping" in his first year jumping in the style.

Craig Carter is coming off a shot put victory Saturday at the Baylor Invitational but will be facing a much tougher field at the prestigious Midwest meet.

Brad Blair and David Pate will carry Aggie hopes into pole vault with Blair posting a season's best of 15-6 while Pate has cleared 15-3. Blair could see drastic improvement. Drake as Blair cleared 15-4 the Aggies' first meet of the season in February and several since while Pate cleared 15-0 in winning the Southwest Conference championship last year.

McPhail and Baker are expected in the 440-yard hurdles with McPhail holding a best time of 1:00 while Baker has run a 58.1.

Gridders prepare for weekend game

The Texas Aggies didn't work long but they covered a lot of things in Wednesday's spring football practice session.

They drilled about an hour and 15 minutes with the offense rehearsing virtually all of its attack while the defense drilled on various assignments and alignments.

It'll be an experienced first team that takes on the second team during the first half of Saturday afternoon's final spring game at Kyle Field.

All 11 defensive starters are back from last year and 10 of the 11 offensive starters return. Fullback Bucky Sams is the only non-starter but he saw a great deal of action last fall.

The offense has only one senior-to-be, center Ricky Seeker. There'll be two sophomores — quarterback David Walker and right guard Billy Lemons—and the other eight will be juniors. They include tight end Richard

Osborne, split end Carl Roaches, tackles Glenn Bujnoch and Dennis Smelser, left guard Bruce Welch, halfbacks Bubba Bean and Skip Walker and Sams.

The defense will be a mite older. There'll be seven seniors and four juniors. The seniors are ends Don Long and Paul Mulin, tackles Warren Trahan and Ted Lamp, middle linebacker Ken Stratton, cornerback Tim Gray and safety James Daniels. The juniors include linebackers Ed Simonini and Garth Ten Napel, cornerback Pat Thomas and safety Jackie Williams.


The Aggies will work again Thursday and then will be off Friday. Saturday's game is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. at Kyle Field.
