Portugal premier ousted

LISBON, Portugal (AP) — Rebellious troops pledging democracy at home and an end to the costly war against black independence movements in Portugal's African territories overthrew the authoritarian government of Premier Marcello Caetano on Thursday.

Gen. Antonio de Spinoza, apparent leader of a new military junta, went on nationwide radio and television early Friday to promise freedom of thought and speech, free elections to the National Assembly and "justice with the citizen having his rights."

Seated beside him were six of the seven junta members, including Spinoza's old military boss, Gen. Francisco da Costa e Gomes. The two were ousted from the leadership of the armed forces in March after Spinoza published a book attacking Portugal's policy of tight military control over its African territories.

Delirious crowds surged through the streets of Lisbon Thursday night and a navy ship fired a tri-

umphal salvo. Unconfirmed reports said at least four persons had been killed in Lisbon, including a police inspector.

Rebel broadcasts said Caetano, 68, and several of his Cabinet ministers had presented their resignations to Gen. Antonio de Spinoza after tanks surrounded them at police headquarters in downtown Lisbon. Caetano's resignation would signify the end of the authoritarian civilian regime that the late Antonio de Oliveira Salazar set up in 1932.

The newspaper O Seculo said Caetano later was escorted to a plane—reportedly by Spinoza—and forced to leave for the Portuguese island of Madeira.

Portugal, the poorest and most backward country in Western Europe, has been spending about 40 per cent of its budget and maintaining 142,000 soldiers in Africa in its struggle to hold on to Angola, Mozambique and Portuguese Guinea.

The drain on the country's manpower and economy has caused major discontent, and Spinoza recently published a book recommending a political solution with rebel elements in the valuable African territories—perhaps a commonwealth system.

Caetano supported a multiracial society in the territories with gradually increasing self-govern-

ment but retention of tight ties to Portugal.

Spinoza and Gen. Francisco da Costa e Gomes were ousted as Portugal's two chief military officers soon after publication of Spinoza's book. Subsequently, on March 16, some 200 army officers angered at the government African policy tried to enter Lisbon with an armored column but were turned back by loyal troops.

In Thursday's rebellion, the rebel broadcasts said President Americo Thomaz and Cabinet members were surrounded at a police stronghold in Lisbon, but O Seculo said Thomaz was holding out in an army barracks at Monsanto near the capital.

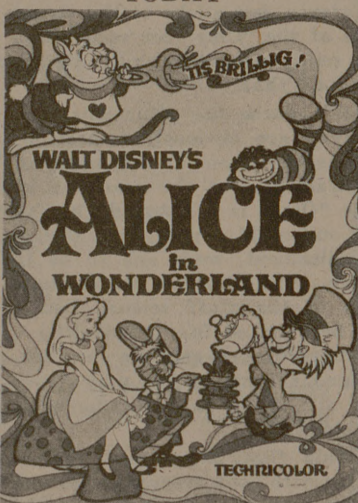
