## Portugal premier ousted

LISBON, Portugal (AP) - Re- umphal salvo. Unconfirmed rebellious troops pledging democracy at home and an end to the costly war against black independence movements in Portugal's African territories overthrew the authoritarian government of Premier Marcello Caetano on Thurs-

Gen. Antonio de Spinola, apparent leader of a new military junta, went on nationwide radio and television early Friday to promise freedom of thought and speech, free elections to the National Assembly and "justice with the citizen having his rights."

Seated beside him were six of the seven junta members, including Spinola's old military boss, Gen. Francisco da Costa e Gomes. The two were ousted from the leadership of the armed forces in March after Spinola published a book attacking Portugal's policy of tight military control over its African territories.

Delirious crowds surged through the streets of Lisbon Thursday night and a navy ship fired a tri-




