

# Taylor outlines responsibilities

The job of the executive director is to carry out projects initiated by the other areas of the Student Government, said Tom Taylor, new SG executive director.

"The primary responsibility of my position is to see that projects are working well and students know what is going on in the Student Government," Taylor explained.

He continued by saying that the job would include aiding the SG president in any manner the president deemed necessary. Expansion and maintenance of present projects are of equal importance, but other groups within the Student Government must make the request for the services of the various divisions under the executive director.

Some of the projects under the supervision of the executive director include Muster, the blood drive, professor evaluation and textbook exchange. These are projects that were begun this year and will be continued next year.

Taylor said he is already getting the rooms for next year's book exchange. He also said he was considering several different systems for the exchange.

"There are several good ways that different schools are using, but they all have their disadvantages," said Taylor.

The areas under Taylor are divided into three separate areas headed by directors. These are director of information, director of projects and election board director. Each director will be a sort of assistant executive director, said Taylor.

The director of information will have authority over all publications under the executive director and research and statistics. They will conduct surveys needed for legislation and for the vice presidents as they are called for. The surveys will be kept in a library in the Student Government office.

"We plan to do research in the social as well as political area," said Taylor. "Anyone can request any kind of research, I guess."

The director of elections will do the job of the old election board chairman, Taylor explained. He expressed a desire to have elections that would result in as few appeals as possible.

"I know there will always be problems but we need to keep them to a minimum," Taylor said. Student Government radio will also be under the jurisdiction of the executive director.

"I want to look into how the present board is working," said Taylor. "It may need to be reorganized."

if approved unless another SG president appointed another chairman with Senate confirmation.

Ward has a 3.25 GPR and plans to take 16 hours next fall. Her qualifications for the position include two years on a high school debating team, minimal debating during her past year here, member of the SCONA XIX planning committee, member of the SG Rules and Regulations committee and executive aide for SG.

"I'm presently looking into the possibility of judicial reform but not just in regard to the Judicial Board," said Ward, adding that she thought the whole system should be centralized.

Eberhard said he felt there was no need to discuss the other two candidates for the positions, but said that their GPR's, slightly below 2.5, had nothing to do with their not being appointed.

Perrin said he has been on the Judicial Board since it was formed two years ago and he is the only member of the original board left.

He said his major qualifications for the position include perfect attendance to all Judicial Board meetings, participation on this year's study of all on-campus judicial systems, member of Review Board B (decides fiscal cases), member of the Academic Appeals Panel, author of the by-laws for next year's Judicial Board and next year's president of the A&M Student Civil Liberties Union.

McRoberts said his qualifications include one year as campus projects chairman, a resident advisor and head resident advisor, member of Puryear judicial board as a sophomore, vice chairman on the Student Services Fees allocations committee and student insurance study committee.

Perrin said he wants to establish a Grand Jury system, a student attorney general, a court docket and a printed list of court procedures.

McRoberts said he would establish an attorney general and a system with a SG prosecutor.


