"We wanted to do more with less," Reedy pointed out. "We purposely made the whole design ambiguous (capable of various uses) to encourage interpretation. We tried to reach a higher level of play, where it becomes a learning experience and a child can use the playground in a different way everyday.

"The activity clusters are psy-chologically linked," noted Tay-lor, "to create a flow of movement and a special experience evolving back into a centralized implied space.'

Apparently, the playground has excited more than the children though. Marlin businessmen, organizations and towns people have donated 230 railroad ties, 25 telephone poles and 660 cubic yards of gravel, sand and dirt to build up the area and provide







