

Labor Day accidents should claim 34

Traffic accidents over the Labor Day Weekend are expected to claim 34 lives, said Texas Highway Department Head Wilson E. Speir. "Earlier this year, the death toll was running up to 30 per cent under the 1973 toll," said Speir. The traffic death toll is on the rise

since the summer began, he said. The rise is blamed on the failure of motorists to observe the 55 miles per hour speed limit and heavier traffic flow.

"All available DPS troopers will be on duty during the holiday period," said Speir.

Department of Public Safety, officers and local law enforcement agencies will be cooperating in their attempts to prevent accidents during the holiday period extending from 6 p.m. Friday to midnight

Monday, he said.

"We are also running a special education program called 'Operation Motoreide'," Speir said. "It is designed to let the public know where and why fatal accidents are occurring during the holiday."

A July release by the National Safety Council, a non-governmental, nonprofit organization, showed that traffic deaths are down nationally by one per cent from 1972.
