## TYC to keep schools open

(AP)—The Texas Youth Council and Atty. Gen. John Hill decided Thursday to appeal a federal judge's order requiring the state to shut down its two reform schools for boys at Gatesville.

Hill said the appeal would be taken to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 5th Circuit at New Orleans.

The basic issue, Hill said, is whether a federal judge has the "authority to mandate a specific, detailed, rigid program of treatment for juvenile delinquents."

He said the council already had "shown a deep commitment to improvement" and should be permitted to carry out its own plans.

Hill also said there was a question whether in a case that involved sweeping changes and increased state expenditures a three-judge court should have been impaneled. Another issue is whether "the mechanics of a plan of treatment must comply in every particular with court-mandated standards and timetables."

Earlier, the council's director said the agency would continue operating its rural reform schools for boys for the time being.

"Specifically concerning the proposed closing of the Gatesville State Schools, I am not in favor of closing any institution at this point. We have determined that although they should not be the sole form of treatment for the juvenile offender, institutions are a necessary form of treatment for many," said Ron Jackson, the council's executive director.

Jackson said the legislature had funded the Gatesville State School and the nearby maximum security Mountain View State School through Sept. 1, 1975, and said the council would comply with that authorization.

"Should this order be determined final, and disrupt that original intention, we will certainly comply, however, at this time, I have no plans to close any TYC institution," Jackson said.

U.S. District Court Judge William Wayne Justice of Tyler ordered radical changes Tuesday in the state's programs to restrain and rehabilitate juvenile delinquents. The order included the closing of the two schools at Gatesville and calls for local handling of juvenile problems in place of the large rural reform schools.

Jackson was sharply critical of the

court order, saying it failed to take into account major revisions in the council's programs in the year since major disturbances at Gatesville forced a change in the composition of the council and the TYC administration.

"I deeply regret that this order was entered on the basis of information presented some 12 months ago, with little or no regard to the Texas Youth Council and its programs as they presently exist," he said.

The council has developed "new approaches not conducive in any way to abuse or ill-treatment of wards, contrary to facts contained in Justice' order," Jackson said.

He said the council supports community programs and is already developing some but feels that the kind of local efforts that would be used if the reform schools are closed would not be "responsible, effective programs."

Juvenile parole is being upgraded and higher standards have been set for council employees, Jackson said.

He said he resented Justice's use of Jerome Miller, former Massachusetts commissioner of youth services, as an expert witness. He said Miller, who called Texas reform schools "crime schools, and a danger to public safety," had spent only three hours at Gatesville.

## Teen hunter school will urge safety

Training in firearms and hunter safety will begin at Pleasant Acres Sept. 14 at 8 a.m. for area boys and girls.

This school marks the beginning of the 48th such school conducted and will continue through the succeeding two months for those between ages 11 and 19. It is conducted by the Twin City Junior Rifle Club under the auspices of the National Rifle Association and YOUTOMORROW, a non-profit educational corporation for the benefit of youth.

Emphasis will be placed on marksmanship and safety, in addition to .22 rifle marksmanship training.

For the hunter there will be instruction in tenting, cooking and orienteering.

Firearms, ranges, tests, ammunition and instruction will be furnished. Students must wear a long-sleeved garment.

## Abandoned cars put up for auction

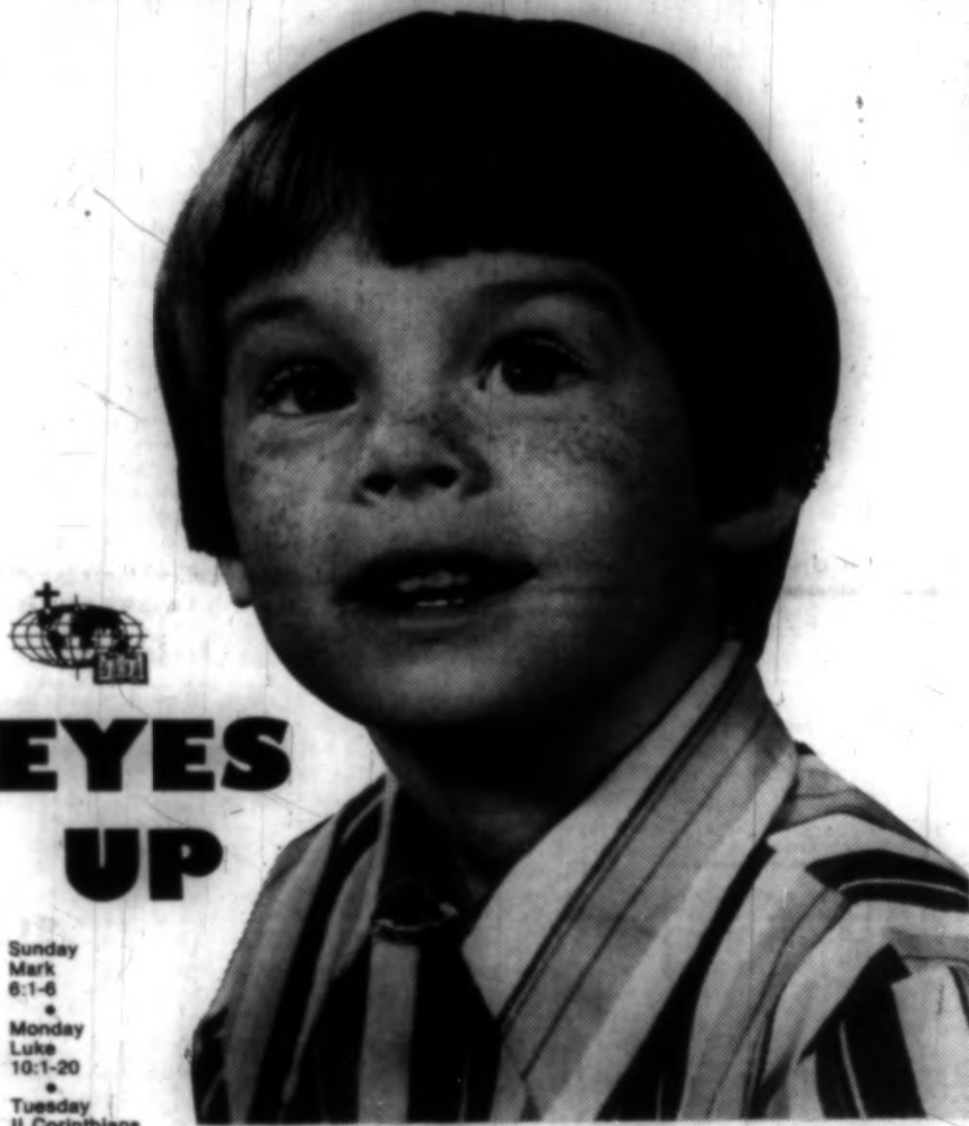
Three automobiles declared abandoned are being auctioned Tuesday by the Bryan City Police.
