Big Thicket established as park

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House approved a compromise bill on Tuesday authorizing establishment of a national park in the Big Thicket area of Texas.

The bill goes to the Senate. The measure, worked out in a compromise between the House and Senate Interior Committees, would create a national park of approximately 85,000 acres.

The Senate had approved a bill earlier this year that would have created an approximately 100,000-acre preserve.

The original House bill, also passed earlier this year, gave the Interior Department authority to quickly acquire the land under a formula known as "legislative taking." The Interior Department is responsible for the national parks.

The Senate objected to the "legislative taking" plan and it was dropped in the compromise measure. Instead, the Secretary of the Interior is directed to acquire the land, compensating its current owners, over the next five to six years.

Basket food prices set new record

WASHINGTON (AP) — The retail cost of a year's supply of farm-produced groceries jumped \$25 in August to a record annual rate of \$1,751 for a typical household, figures released by the Agriculture Department showed Tuesday.

Higher prices for beef, pork and eggs accounted for much of the increase. Lower prices were reported for milk, lettuce and bread.

Officials said the dollar increase, amounting to 1.4 per cent from July to August, was the largest since the indicator rose \$52 or 3.1 per cent on an annual basis from last January to February.

Recommendations made to fill open student positions

The Credentials Committee, a branch of the Student Rules and Regulations Committee, recommended three students for vacant Senate positions Tuesday.

They are, Joe Marcello, recommended for graduate College of Science; Rajesh Kent, recommended for Law, Puryear and Athletic dorms; and Fran McNeely, recommended for Graduate-Off Campus.

These recommendations will be voted on at tonight's Senate meeting.

The Judiciary Board lacked a quorum and postponed last night's meeting until 8:30 p.m., Oct. 1 in the Student Program Office. The judicial power of injunction will be discussed.

Patterned after state and federal law, Senate by-laws grant the power of injunction to the Judicial Board but not the executive or legislative branches, claim members of the Judicial Board. The legality of such a power is being studied by both the Judicial Board and the Senate.
