Answer: Gene Stallings. Gene Stallings was the Aggie head mentor for seven years and was the last coach to guide the Aggies to a bowl appearance. Stallings was replaced by Emory Bellard in 1972 and is now the defensive backfield coach for the Dallas Cowboys. Stallings had a 27-45-1 record with A&M. How does he feel about his
