

## Boston mayor asks for US assistance

BOSTON (AP) — Mayor Kevin H. White on Tuesday requested that U. S. marshals be stationed in South Boston to keep racial violence over school integration from spreading to other parts of the city.

"Without additional assistance, the school buses cannot roll in South Boston, the court-ordered busing plan cannot be implemented and

the general safety of the community cannot be assured," White said.

"Unless adequate assistance is forthcoming, the volatile situation in one isolated area of the city can spread rapidly and relentlessly throughout the entire city," White said. "And unless the intense burden on the police can be relieved in

South Boston, our efforts in other sections will be totally frustrated."

Scattered incidents of violence have broken out in other sections of the city in recent days.

There was no immediate response on the request for federal marshals from U. S. District Court Judge W. Arthur Garrity, who ordered that black and white children be bused when schools opened Sept. 12.

At least eight people were injured Tuesday when violence erupted at English High School. The school, on the fringe of predominantly black Roxbury, had been generally peaceful until now.

At Technical High School in Roxbury, about 75 black pupils stoned cars, smashed school windows and burned a black teacher's car.

Until this week, most of the disruption over integration was confined to South Boston, a working class Irish neighborhood.

## Council to prepare evaluation reports

An organizational meeting of the Student Academic Council (SAC) will be Thursday at 7:30 p.m. in room 204 Harrington Center.

The evaluation will probably be in questionnaire form on computer sheets, Dunn said.

Dunn plans to have teacher evaluations completed by the end of the semester. The evaluations may be only on new professors, but will

## AAUP criticizes dismissal

WASHINGTON (AP) — The American Association of University Professors (AAUP) has criticized the University of Texas Board of Regents and Chancellor Charles LeMaistre for the firing of UT-Austin President Stephen Spurr.

In a letter to LeMaistre and Regents Chairman A. G. McNeese, AAUP General Secretary Dr. Joseph Duffey said the regents "appear to have acted... without having provided the faculty and other academic components of the university with the opportunity to register their legitimate concern."

Duffey said the letter was written to express "our association's strong sense of concern over the summary dismissal of Spurr from the Presidents."

A meeting of the University of Texas general faculty last week approved a resolution calling for LeMaistre's resignation. The regents have refused to make public LeMaistre's reasons for dismissing Spurr as president.

To be eligible to purchase the Texas A&M Undergraduate student must have at least one residence and credit for at least ninety-two (92) credit hours. A year in residence may consist of the fall spring semester or the first and second terms. The student must be a resident of the State of Texas to October 21, 1974 may be used in satisfying the residence requirement. Students qualifying under this rule should leave their names with the registrar, Richard Coke building. This should be done by October 21st in order for all records to be audited to determine grid eligibility. Students already in ninety-two (92) completed hours on record may at any time. Graduate students are eligible to re-proof (receipt) that they have filed for graduation. Students who fail to leave their names in advance will be asked to return later to allow times for names to be checked. The rings are due to arrive at the Registrar Office on January 25, 1975. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 24, 1974 or December 1, 1974 will arrive at the same time. The ring clerk will call from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.
