

# Teacher's training needs being studied

TAMU researcher Doug Goodgame is undertaking a project to determine the training needs of adult education teachers.

The Texas Education Agency is funding the study which will encompass approximately 2,500 adult educators across the state. The purpose of the study, Goodgame said, is to "factually define the job types in adult education."

He defined the data gathering device as "a job inventory which requires about nine months to create and lists over 600 tasks performed by adult educators."

"Each person is then asked to go

through the list and describe his job using the 600 statements that chronicle the work functions performed by all personnel in the profession," said Goodgame.

A scale will determine how time is distributed in the performance of the tasks in each person's position.

"A set of 23 computer programs will be used to analyze the data," Goodgame said. They are the Comprehensive Occupational Data Analysis Programs (CODAP).

Goodgame said that the most powerful program in the system "is the clustering routine which clus-

ters or groups workers together according to the functional similarity of tasks performed and time spent on the tasks."

Other programs describe the work performed by people in the clusters and the characteristics of the people who make up the clusters or job types.

## TAMU receives marine research grant from NOAA

Texas A&M received a Sea Grant of \$1,353,250 for marine-related research, education, and advisory services, said Rep. Olin E. (Tiger) Teague announced Tuesday in Washington.

The grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce's National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is for partial support of A&M's 1974-75 Sea Grant Program.

Funds from other sources, including a \$300,000 appropriation from Texas' 63rd Legislature, bring the budget for the year to \$2,088,180 according to Dr. John C. Calhoun, Jr., vice president for academic affairs and director of the Sea Grant College Program.

Willis H. Clark, associate director, said the new federal grant is 25 percent greater than last year's \$1,080,000.

The program was enacted by Congress in 1966 to encourage wise development of marine resources through matching fund grants to universities, laboratories and other institutions.

Texas A&M's 1974-75 Sea Grant Program comprises 37 separate projects in nine of A&M's ten colleges and at Baylor College of Medicine, Brazosport College, Lamar University, the University of Houston, and the State Education Agency's Regional Service Center at Corpus Christi.

# U.S. seeks new Mideast settlement

CAIRO (AP)—Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger flew to Cairo Wednesday to begin a new search for a Mideast peace settlement. He immediately called on Egyptian President Anwar Sadat.

Senior U.S. officials told newsmen the Middle East situation had improved in the past year, but they foresaw likely new ties between the Soviet Union and Cairo, including the possibility that Moscow soon will resume arms shipments to

Egypt. The Soviets already are sending in spare parts for rundown equipment. While Israel and Syria are said to be stronger militarily than before the October war, U.S. intelligence estimates a slight falling off in the Egyptians' fire power.

A visit by Soviet leader Leonid Brezhnev to Cairo is highly probable, a senior U.S. official said.

"President Ford is committed to American efforts to settle the Middle East conflict," Kissinger told newsmen at the airport on his arrival for his sixth Middle East mission since the October war a year ago.

He is making himself available to work out the terms on a future visit, much as he arranged an Israeli withdrawal from the Suez front and the Golan Heights earlier this year.

But he is loath to get involved in an extended operation and will offer several options to leaders in Egypt, Syria, Jordan and Israel. Among them are having the foreign ministers make alternate visits to Washington and on the spot talks between the negotiating parties under U.N. auspices.
