

Kennedy's wife in three-car accident

FAIRFAX, Va. (AP)—Joan Kennedy, wife of Sen. Edward N. Kennedy, D-Mass., was charged with driving under the influence of alcohol Wednesday after her convertible was involved in a three-car accident, Fairfax County police said. Police said Mrs. Kennedy was administered a breathalyzer test but would not disclose the results. The charge lodged against her is the only charge in the state of Virginia if alcohol or drugs are detected, no matter how much is found, police said. Mrs. Kennedy, who was later released on her own recognizance, was driving southbound on Route

123 at about 1:45 p.m. EDT when her auto struck another southbound vehicle that was stopped for a traffic light at an intersection, police said.

The area is a Washington, D.C., suburb near the Kennedy home in McLean, Va.

The impact knocked the second vehicle into the rear of a third vehicle, police said. There were no injuries, and police estimated the damage to all three vehicles at \$1,400.

Mrs. Kennedy, 38, was taken to the magistrate's court in nearby McLean, Va., where she was released.

Mrs. Kennedy has spent time in recent months in a New Canaan, Conn., sanitarium and a California rest home for a rest because of fatigue and mental strain resulting from the illness of her oldest son, Edward Jr., who lost a leg to bone cancer.

Richard C. Drayne, the senator's press secretary, said she left the California clinic last month to join Kennedy at the Boston news conference Sept. 23 in which he announced he would not run for the presidency in 1976.

Since then, Drayne said, she has been at her McLean home.

He said that no one was injured in the accident.
