Southwest Conference race promises to be a wild one

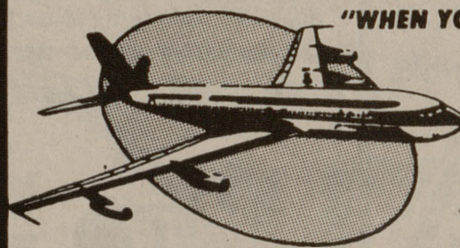

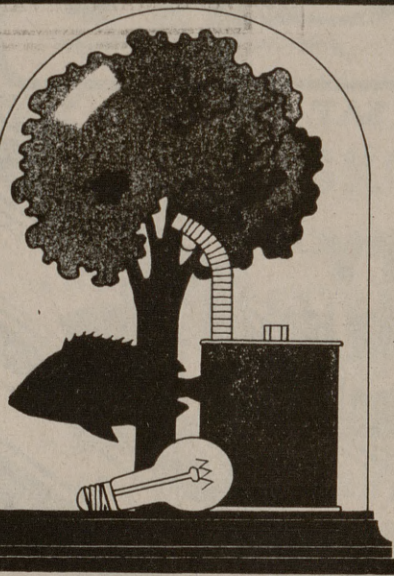
