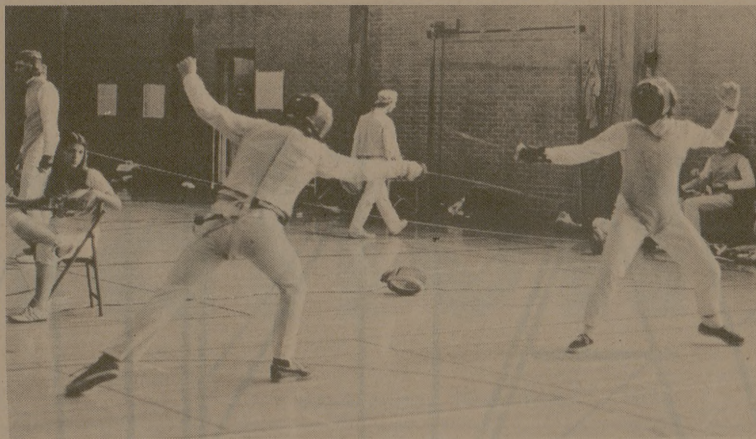
The Ags lost to SMU 8-0 in a rain-soaked contest Sunday. The Ags are now 2-2-2 for the season with four games remaining.

## Leaks earns starting berth in crucial Baylor-UT game

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) — All-American Roosevelt Leaks, playing on a rebuilt knee months before doctors thought it possible, will start at fullback Saturday when Texas plays Baylor in a crucial Southwest Conference game.

Texas Coach Darrell Royal disclosed at a news conference Monday that Leaks would replace freshman Earl Campbell in the starting lineup even before he told the players.

Royal said Leaks, a sub his senior year because of the injury, had earned a starting berth with his per-

formance in Texas' 35-15 victory over Southern Methodist last Saturday.

"This is not a putdown to Earl," Royal said. "He's an outstanding football player, and he will continue to play."

Campbell leads Longhorn rushers with 654 yards on 111 carries for five touchdowns. Leaks, who set a SWC record last year by running for 1,415 yards, has gained only 305 yards on 68 carries this season, and Royal said, "he's not full blown, not back where he was," but "he's more near like the ol' Roosevelt each week."

Royal said in 18 seasons at Texas he has never had a running back overcome as severe a knee injury as Leaks has, following the spring training mishap.

Royal was asked if Leaks had told him the knee was better, and Royal replied, "I don't ask him. I'm not going by what he tells me. I'm going by what I see" on the field.

He reminded reporters that Leaks was a consensus all-American his junior year and third in the balloting for the Heisman Trophy as college football's best player, yet had dropped from being "everybody's darlin' to a sub" because of the injury.

"He's had an outstanding attitude, an outstanding team attitude this year," Royal said, "and this is quite a compliment to the young man. He pulls for Earl. . . it's been

good. . . that takes a pretty big man."

Leaks' presence in the starting lineup should give Texas an extra dose of spirit for the Baylor game, which Royal says "is our biggest SWC challenge since we lost the opening game to Texas Tech."

Texas is 3-1 in the SWC, and Baylor is 2-1. The loser faces almost certain elimination in the conference race for the host spot in the Cotton Bowl Jan. 1.

Royal said, "We've had nothing but trouble when we've gone over there to Waco. They're going to be sky high."

"Those ol' Baylor grads who want to see the Bears put their best foot forward ought to show up."

### Matuszak to stay with NFL til '78

HOUSTON (AP) — John Matuszak, the big Houston Oilers tackle now playing with the Kansas City Chiefs of the National Football League, won't be going to the World Football League before 1978, an appeals court ruled Wednesday.

The 2-1 ruling by the 14th Court of Civil Appeals came in a suit filed by the Oilers after Matuszak jumped to the Houston Texans of the WFL. The Texans have since moved to Shreveport and the Oilers traded Matuszak to the Chiefs Oct. 22.

The Oilers obtained a restraining order from District Court Judge Arthur Leshar stopping Matuszak from playing with the Texans after he walked out of the Oilers training camp and played one WFL game.

The upholding of the restraining order will keep Matuszak with the Chiefs until his present contract runs out in 1978, unless a trial on the merits of the case frees him.

In the appeals decision, Chief Justice Bert Tunks of the court dissented. He said the lower court should not lend its powers "to the enforcement of a contract which is in violation of the state antitrust laws."

The court recommended a trial on the merits of the case, pointing out that it "is the appropriate forum for disposition of these issues."

However no trial date has been set.
