Drugs to be studied

New BVDC program

A proposed drug abuse program will be reviewed by the Brazos Valley Development Council (BVDC) Board of Directors at its quarterly meeting at 7:30 p.m. Thursday in the Medallion Room of the Bryan Utilities Building.

The Drug Abuse Intervention

and Prevention is proposed to be a one-year program serving the seven counties in the Brazos Valley Reg-

The project's goals include lowering recidivism, the rate imprisoned addicts return to jails, said Glenn H. Cook, executive director of BVDC.

SG decides not to waste Senate time


