CS board grants protested request

A variance of the city's zoning ordinance allowing Bob Rice to construct a carport five feet from his property line was granted at Tuesday night's meeting of the College Station Zoning Board of Adjustments.

The carport is to be an extension of a garage built under the old zoning ordinance requiring a 5-foot lot setback as opposed to the 7-foot clearance prescribed by the present ordinance.

A letter signed by eight area property owners was submitted to the board in protest of the request. One of the signers, Mrs. Carl Tax, said the garage had been converted into an apartment.

Tax said she was worried that the

proposed carport would be converted into an apartment in the future, contributing to the overcrowding and traffic problems in the neighborhood.

Rice said the apartment is currently used by his mother-in-law and would never be rented commercially.

The board granted the request as an extension of an existing non-conforming use (a power specifically granted the board in the zoning ordinance).

Fredda Austin, board chairman, reiterated the board's request at their meeting that the city staff prepare a form for requesting a hearing before the board. The form would include the exact reasons for the request and other pertinent data.
