Police find evidence, murder charge filed

AUSTIN (AP) — A 42-year-old slope-shouldered man with a bizarre background was charged Wednesday with the mutilation slayings of two Mormon missionaries who ate dinner with him every Monday night.

"No, we don't have any bodies. We have body parts," Police Chief Bob Miles said in answer to a question at a news conference. The slayings occurred "during the act of robbery," he said.

The parts have been positively identified as belonging to Gary Smith Darley, 20, of Simi Valley, Calif., and Mark J. Fischer, 19, of Milwaukee, Wis., Miles said.

Robert Elmer Kleason, who joined the Mormon church here, was accused of the slayings in a complaint signed by Texas Ranger Wallace Spillar before Justice of the Peace Jim McMurtry. Bond was set at \$100,000.

penetratingly with dark brown eyes. A week's worth of reddish-brown stubble bristled on his heavy jowls.

He was visited briefly by his girl friend, Linda Miller, a heavy-set piano teacher from Longview, Tex., who told reporters they had corresponded for four or five months but had never met.

Miss Miller said Kleason told her he had nothing to do with the disappearance of the missionaries. "Yes, he did tell me that much, and I believe him," she said.

Kleason allegedly is a fugitive from Wayne County, New York, where he is charged with an assault felony.

A bloody watch and a bullet-pierced name tag which Darley wore over his heart reportedly were found during a search of Kleason's mobile home. The mobile home had been stolen from a lot in nearby Oak Hill a year ago, police said Wednesday.

The missionaries disappeared on the afternoon of Oct. 28, a few hours before they were to have eaten with Kleason. Their car was found stripped of its wheels and tires on a parking lot of an apartment complex Nov. 4.

Tires matching the description of those taken from the car were found in a shed near Kleason's mobile home on Nov. 6 by a Mormon who was a member of a volunteer search party.



Boxcar fire billed to Brazos County

A boxcar fire two weeks ago cost the city of College Station Fire Department \$1,415; it billed Brazos County.

The bill for fire protection outside the city limits was presented at Monday's Commissioners Court meeting. Questions were raised at the meeting regarding the bill and a charge for 283 engine miles in particular.

Fire Chief Doug Landua said the bill was for the equivalent of 283 miles of travel wear placed on the fire truck by pumping 10 hours to extinguish the fire.

Landua said the engine of a truck runs constantly during pumping and the odometer is set to record mileage during that time.

"It's pumping that wears out an engine, not driving," Landua said.

The boxcar was two to three miles outside town when the call was received, Landua said. It was towed into town to reach a water source, he added.

The nearest point where the car could be sidetracked to allow train passage on the tracks was the F&B crossing.

The city bills the county for any fire calls answered outside the city limits. Mileage costs and equipment wear (a crow bar was broken in the last case) are the bulk of the expense.

Singers premier in Bryan tonight


America's growth and heritage will be the theme of the Community Singers' season premiere performance tonight at 8 o'clock in the Bryan Civic Auditorium.
