

Rockefellers' wealth totals over a billion

WASHINGTON (AP) — The investments held by three generations of Rockefellers, either outright or in trust, total more than \$1 billion, the family's financial adviser said Tuesday.

But J. Richardson Dilworth told the House Judiciary Committee the holdings are scattered among 84 individuals who never pool their resources or act together.

"It should be stressed that both the family members and their investment advisers in the family office are totally uninterested in controlling anything," Dilworth said at the confirmation hearings on Nelson Rockefeller's nomination to be vice president. The aim of both the family and their economic advisers is simply to make more money, Dilworth said.

Rockefeller's wealth and its pos-

sible impact on the economy has been a major concern of the committee, and Dilworth's testimony was sought in hopes it would shed some light on the subject.

But the picture of stock portfolios is so extensive it takes 154 people to manage them, the talk of convertible stocks, coupons and fiduciary obligations and the fact the vast holdings of the Rockefeller Foundation and other family-connected funds were not included in Dilworth's presentation left most members little more enlightened than they had been.

Dilworth said his testimony marked the first time an aggregate or Rockefeller family investments had ever been put together. It showed the 84 family members own either outright or in trust a total of \$295,388,000 in stocks, bonds and

real estate which are managed by Dilworth and his associates in the family office.

In addition, they are beneficiaries in two trusts with assets totaling \$738,600,000 which are supervised by independent trust companies.

Dilworth listed the major stock holdings in the two categories, which amounted to a roster of leading U.S. corporations.

The totals do not include any personal residential property, jewelry or other personal belongings, nor do they include Nelson Rockefeller's art collection, which he has valued at \$33 million.

In a separate financial statement he submitted to the committee earlier, Nelson Rockefeller gave his total net worth as \$62.6 million, plus being the beneficiary in trusts worth \$116 million.

Canceled checks show scheme of Ma Bell's political slush fund

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP) — More canceled checks from an alleged political slush fund by Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. have surfaced.

The checks roughly follow a \$50-a-month scheme for political contributions by top Bell executives which the late T. O. Gravitt sketched out in his suicide note.

The Associated Press obtained copies of the checks, which were written by James H. Ashley, Southwestern Bell's commercial manager in San Antonio who was dismissed in an internal investigation.

Asked about the checks, Ashley said he was told to contribute the money. Of the five politicians whose 1974 campaigns were recipients of the checks, Ashley said he had no personal interest in the races and did not know two of the candidates personally.

One of the candidates to which Ashley contributed was in Austin, away from Ashley's home district here.

Gravitt, who was chief of Bell's Texas operations until his death Oct. 17 in Dallas, had a notation in his suicide note about \$50 monthly to politicians based on \$1,000 annual raises given to the top echelons of executives in Texas.

Ashley's canceled checks were: —\$50 to Wilson Foreman campaign manager, March 22. Foreman was a state representative from Austin for years until he was defeated in the 1974 spring Democratic primary by Gonzalo Barrientos.

—\$50 to Nelson Wolff campaign manager, May 16. Wolff, a San Antonio state senator, ran unsuccessfully this spring for the Democratic nomination for the Dist. 21 U.S. House post.

—\$100 to John Traeger campaign manager, Feb. 19. Traeger of Seguin retained his state senate seat in this year's elections.

—\$50 to Leo Mendoza campaign manager, April 23. Mendoza ran successfully for a peace justice post in San Antonio while retaining his city council seat. Bell has a pending request before the city council here for a rate increase.

—\$100 to Robert Krueger campaign manager, Aug. 5. Krueger defeated Wolff in the Democratic congressional primary and then beat a Republican opponent this fall to

succeed retiring Rep. O. C. Fisher, D-Tex.

The checks total \$350 over a seven-month period.

Ashley said he met Foreman only once but did not know him. "Why would I be interested in a race in Austin, Tex., of a guy I didn't know?"

Ashley said he had never met Krueger.

Ward K. Wilkinson of Dallas, Southwestern Bell vice president for public affairs, has said Bell executives are encouraged to contribute to candidates of their choice. He declined comment when asked whether the executives were coerced.

Ashley said, "Wilkinson would send a note to Porter Mitchell, general staff manager in San Antonio, and the Mitchell would either send Ward's note or call me or send a note of his own."

Mitchell, contacted by The Associated Press, would not confirm or deny his part in such a procedure. "I don't think that I have any comment at all, due to all the litigation," Mitchell said.

Ashley, dismissed for misconduct after Gravitt's death, has joined the Gravitt family in a \$29.2 million defamation and libel suit against Southwestern Bell.

To be eligible to purchase the Texas A&M ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one year residence and credit for at least sixty (60) credit hours. A year in residence may consist of the fall or spring semester or one of the above and a full course session (both the first and second terms). This should be passed at the preliminary grade report period in October 21, 1974 may be used in satisfying this residence requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation should leave their names with the ring clerk, on seven, Richard Coke Building. This should be done by October 21 in order for all records to be ready to determine ring eligibility. Students who have not yet completed ninety-two (92) completed hours on record may not receive the ring until they have completed the required hours. Graduate students are eligible to receive the ring (receipt) that they have filed for graduation to October 21 in order for all records to be ready to determine ring eligibility. Students who have not yet completed the required hours on record may not receive the ring until they have completed the required hours. The rings are due to arrive at the Registrar's Office on January 28, 1975. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on October 24, 1974 or December 10, will arrive at the same time. The ring clerk is located from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. of each Monday through Friday. However, in order for the rings to be checked, orders must be placed prior to during this ordering period. We hope this information will be helpful and extend our congratulations.
