

Bill should offer grants

AUSTIN (AP) — Rep. Senfronia Thompson, D-Houston, said Wednesday she will introduce a bill next session to set up a \$25 million program of grants for needy college students over a two-year period.

The legislation was recommended by a special committee which she headed.

The Committee on State Scholarship Programs also recommended substituting the grants for numerous tuition exemptions, such as those for children from families whose income is less than \$4,800 a year and exemptions for alien students from Latin America.
