

Rockefeller Commission to view Kennedy films

# Conspiracy evidence brought to CIA probe

WASHINGTON (AP) — Comedian Dick Gregory gave the Rockefeller Commission what he claimed Tuesday was new evidence that President John F. Kennedy was the victim of a CIA assassination plot.

Gregory's claim was based on amateur moving picture film of the assassination and on a newspaper photograph made soon afterward. Both have been examined previously by the Warren Commission, which conducted the official government investigation of Kennedy's death, and other investigators.

A spokesman for the Rockefeller Commission, created by President Ford to investigate allegations of domestic spying by the CIA, said "we will consider every bit" of evidence presented by Gregory and two associates.

Robert Groden, 29, who identified himself as a "photographer and photo optical specialist" working with Gregory, showed the moving picture film at a news conference. Ralph Schoenman, also a Gregory associate, displayed a still photograph which he said showed

E. Howard Hunt and Frank Sturgis at the scene of the assassination.

The moving picture consisted of film made by Abraham Zapruder as Kennedy was shot while his motorcade passed by the Texas School Book Depository in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963, with some footage splices in some film Groden said was made by another amateur, Orville Fixon.

The Zapruder film shows Kennedy clutching at his throat and beginning to lean forward after he is

first hit, when suddenly the right side of his head explodes and he rocks violently backward and to the right.

Groden said this clearly shows that Kennedy was killed by a shot from the front and not from the School Book Depository to the rear, as concluded by the Warren Commission. This argument has been made by critics of the Warren Commission report since it first appeared.

Groden also said the movie film showed a rifleman hiding in a clump of trees and another man pointing a rifle from a grassy knoll near where Zapruder was standing.

Other critics in the past have made the same argument in contending that Lee Harvey Oswald, identified by the Warren Commission as the sole assassin, did not act alone. Frames purportedly showing men in blow-ups from the movie

film were indistinct and reporters at Gregory's news conference — as in the past — could not tell whether the film showed hidden men or shadowy effects caused by leaves and poor lighting in the jumpy amateur film.

The Warren Commission examined the original film. Time magazine owns the original Zapruder film and has never shown it publicly. Groden declined to say

where he obtained a copy.

Schoenman said the still photo showed Hunt and Sturgis with a third man shortly after the assassination. He said the third man is a "dead ringer" for an FBI man wanted in the slaying of Martin Luther King.

Schoenman said the men were identified as Hunt and Sturgis were operatives and were disguised as tramps.

## Warrant issued for Carmichael and ten car corporation officials

DALLAS (AP) — Arrest warrants charging conspiracy to commit theft were issued Wednesday by the Dallas County Sheriff's office against Mrs. Elizabeth Carmichael, president of Twentieth Century Motor Car Corp., a firm that moved to Texas from California last week.

Sheriff deputies went through the home of Mrs. Carmichael Wednesday evening and were told by a neighbor she had not been in the house all day.

Deputies also sought Mrs. Carmichael and other officers of the corporation in the firm's new headquarters where they found only a representative of the official receiver for the company appointed by a state district court Tuesday.

A spokesman for the sheriff's office said the arrest warrants also named some officers of the corporation.

Twentieth Century Motor Car Corp. moved here from Encino, Calif. announcing that it intended to start production of its three-wheel Revette by the middle of the year. It claimed the auto can give 70 miles per gallon of gas and is made of a new plastic material that withstands crashes of up to 30 miles per hour without damage.

The company moved here shortly after it was enjoined in California by the State Department of Corporations from selling stock in the firm to the public. The state agency said the firm did not have enough capital to back up investments.

A spokesman for the District Attorney's office said the charges against the corporation's directors were filed in the court of Justice of the Peace Robert Cole who set individual bonds at \$25,000. Ten officers of the corporation, along with Mrs. Carmichael, were named in the arrest warrants.

On Tuesday, State District Judge Dee Brown Walker, at the request of the Dallas Attorney's office, issued a temporary restraining order prohibiting the company from selling stock in Texas and from engaging in "deceptive trade practices."

Judge Walker also appointed attorney W. R. Sessions receiver for Twentieth Century Motor Car. He kept records and assets of the company intact pending further action.

The California Corporation Commission said Tuesday that Carmichael had violated a desist and refrain order against selling stock in California. The commission said it had obtained a court order to force the company to comply with subpoena and turn over its books. Feb. 1 for examination.

The California Securities and Exchange Commission was reported to be looking into the company's operations, but an SEC official would neither confirm nor deny that investigation was under way.
