# 'Futurist' to speak

## Leads off for 7 speakers

Barry Bruce-Briggs, specialist in studies of how present policy will affect the future, will keynote the 20th Student Conference on National Affairs (SCONA XX).

Bruce-Briggs will lead off seven major SCONA presentations. "As keynoter, Mr. Bruce-Briggs will present an overview of the conference," explained Chairman John Nash. "We have asked him to emphasize futuristics and describe some of the techniques."

Bruce-Briggs is a former staff member of the Hudson Institute, a government advisory group formerly in foreign policy. He is now consultant to the Rockefeller Commission on Critical Choices for Americans, and the Smith Richard-

son Foundation.

The one-time Philadelphia city planning consultant co-authored, with Herman Kahn, "Things To Come."

Bruce-Briggs has contributed to policy and futures studies for the Department of Defense, U. S. Army and Navy, NASA, U. S. Park Service, Coca-Cola Co. and the Kettering Foundation.

The SCONA speaker took part in economic development studies in Algeria, Sweden and Korea. He was a consultant for the Canadian government, the Scott Commission investigating New York City, the Department of Housing and Urban Development and Office for Economic Opportunity.

His work as a policy analyst concentrates on long-term future implications of present policy choices.

# MSC gas week set by Directorate

# Bell lawyers want delay, request change of venue

SAN ANTONIO (AP)—Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. lawyers gained Monday a delay in trial of a \$29.2 million damage suit against it in state district court.

Judge James C. Onion set trial for May 12 during a pretrial hearing.

Lawyers for ousted Bell executive James H. Ashley and the family of T. O. Gravit, who headed Bell's Texas operations before committing suicide last October, had sought a trial date in March.

However, Bell's head counsel, Hubert Green, said a March hearing would be "premature."

"There is no reason why the telephone company would want to drag out this case," Green said. "But we cannot properly and promptly dispose of it."

Green said other investigations arising from the suit, including those by the Securities and Exchange Commission, a federal

grand jury, the state attorney general's office and a state legislative investigation, hampered Bell lawyers from preparing.

Green said also that extensive news coverage should be allowed to subside so as not to be prejudicial to Bell.
