Judge James C. Onion set trial for May 12 during a pretrial hearing. Lawyers for ousted Bell executive James H. Ashley and the family of T. O. Gravitt, who headed Bell's Texas operations before committing suicide last October, had sought a

trial date in March. However, Bell's head counsel, Hubert Green, said a March hear-

ing would be "premature. There is no reason why the telephone company would want to drag out this case," Green said. "But we cannot properly and promptly dis-

lawyers from preparing. Green said also that extensive news coverage should be allowed to subside so as not to be prejudicial to


