Her goals: "To see if I can do beter. I hope we do good at the regonal tournament and the Houston



## **Tech beats** SMU 74-61 for 5th win

LUBBOCK, Tex. (AP) — Rick Bullock led a balanced Texas Tech attack here Tuesday night as the Red Raiders hit quick and early for a 74-61 Southwest Conference basketball victory over Southern Methodist University.

Bullock helped move the Raiders into a 12-0 lead early in the game and the Raiders held back the SMU Mustangs to go into the intermission with a 39-25 advantage.

The victory gave Texas Tech a 5-2 mark in league play and dropped the Mustangs to a 3-4 record.

Tech's lead in the second half was stretched to 19 points before the Mustangs cut it down to eight in the last few minutes, but Bullock's free throws again put the Raiders


Bullock ended the night with 17 points followed by William Johnson and Phil Bailey with 12 and Grady Newton with 10.
