

editor, was found guilty by the Alpha Phi Omega Election Commission of violating the Texas Student Publications election code while running for the office by "continually campaigning in university owned dormitories." He had been warned by a resident assistant that such activities were prohibited by dorm policies.

Garland maintains that although his campaign activities carried him to several men's dorms, he did not think such canvassing was in viola-tion of the election rules. There is a Student Court hearing today to determine whether the disqualification will be allowed to stand.

If Garland's disqualification is upheld, the issue becomes confusing. The Election Commission must choose whether to name secondplace Tagliarino editor-elect or to call for a new election or even to dump the matter on the board by reporting only that a vacancy exists in the editor's position.


Society opens nominations
