

Student left waiting

AUSTIN (AP)—Time ran out for a Richardson college student Tuesday who waited for an hour and a half to protest appointees to the Texas College Coordinating Board.

David Holtkamp of the University of Texas at Austin was advised to come back Wednesday if he had something "disastrous" to tell.

Senate committee members approved seven appointees by Gov. Dolph Briscoe after extensive questioning, then quit as the Senate was going into session.

Holtkamp told newsmen that Harold Herndon of San Antonio and Mrs. Jess Hay of Dallas, wife of one of Briscoe's major fundraisers, especially "appear to be grossly unqualified and disinterested — they are unaware of many of the problems that are crucial for the universities in our state."

Holtkamp repeatedly shook his

head "no" at the appointees' responses to committee questions and later said that none was a faculty member or had ever been a faculty member.

By their own admission, he said, the appointees "are entirely ignorant of what universities are or how they are run — it seems as if their appointments are for political consideration and not for any qualification."

Although Holtkamp had filed a card to testify, Sen. Mike McKinnon, D-Corpus Christi, permitted the joint meeting of the education and nominations committees to vote without hearing from Holtkamp.

Holtkamp talked to Sen. Jack Ogg, D-Houston, and Ogg said McKinnon simply had "forgot about him. But if he has something disastrous to say, we can hear it tomorrow."

McKinnon confirmed that Holtkamp could testify Wednesday, even though the appointees to the board have been approved.

Mrs. Hay was asked by Ogg about any potential financial conflicts of interest, and she said, "I don't even know what we have." On another occasion, she said, "I'm not sure. He keeps the bank account."

Ford Albritton Jr. of Bryan, another appointee, admitted that he had contributed up to \$9,000 to Briscoe's past two campaigns, but he indicated he did not think there was any connection between the donations and his appointment.

Tony Bonilla noted that Briscoe had appointed him to the board even though "I didn't even support him" for governor.

"The governor never says to us, 'I want this or I want that.' He just asks for information," said Mrs. Hay.

Tax system streamlined

State refunds in record time

NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP)—There is little tax time at tax time when it comes to getting state income tax refunds back to Louisiana taxpayers.

Thousands of the state's residents

are finding — much to their surprise — tax refund checks in their mail boxes within 10 days after filing their returns.

"We've lived here 17 years and it never happened like this before,"

said Mrs. William S. Hart of New Orleans. "My two sons sent their returns in and got their refunds within one week. I think that's phenomenal."

William E. Ligon of Monroe got his refund within seven days. "It really was astonishing," he said.

The list could go on and on. State Tax Collector Joseph N. Traile said in an interview here that more than 200,000 taxpayers already have got back refunds within 10 days filing their returns.

Traile, at 32 one of the youngest top officials in government, took office in 1972 and vowed to reorganize a Revenue Department that was so archaic he ranked it as an antique.

Traile has streamlined, consolidated, installed \$1.5 million worth of computer equipment and set up machines for assembly line-style processing at his office in Baton Rouge, the capital.

The operation has such things as color-coded envelopes, and there are three audits of tax returns and a daily mailing of refunds. This year about 40 per cent have been caught as wrong — mostly because the filer claimed too low a refund.

Traile said 950,000 returns are expected before the April 15 deadline — a one-third increase in three years.

LA judge faces removal

Jurist accused of misconduct

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—A Los Angeles woman judge, accused of maliciously jailing defense lawyers, and threatening a policeman with a .38-caliber vasectomy, has been recommended for removal from office.

The miniskirted jurist has also been accused of willful misconduct, to wit: hearing court cases while a pet Chihuahua nestled in her lap and keeping a mechanical canary which chirped away from her pink-trimmed chambers.

The ouster of Municipal Court Judge Noel Cannon was recom-

mended Monday by the state Commission on Judicial Qualifications.

Cannon said she would have no comment on the recommendation.

With the presentation of charges to the California Supreme Court here, the 48-year-old judge was immediately disqualified from hearing cases until the issue is settled.

The commission found that Cannon had on 15 occasions engaged in willful misconduct in office and had 10 times acted with prejudicial conduct that brought the judicial office into disrepute. Nine other charges

were dismissed.

The commission said Cannon, a Stanford Law School graduate appointed to the bench by former Gov. Edmund G. Brown in 1963, made special arrangements to have bailiffs immediately whisk away lawyers she might find in contempt.

The policeman who drew her wrath was Officer Richard G. Fagin, a motorcycle cop who reprimanded the judge for honking her horn repeatedly at a motorist stopped in front of her.

The commission said that during the Nov. 30, 1972, incident Cannon

became infuriated and told Fagin "You go to hell, officer."

She then went to her chambers and allegedly told her bailiff, "The son of a bitch. I want him brought in right away. Give me a gun. I'm going to shoot his cles off and give him a .38-vasectomy."

"I'm not going to take the bait until you find that male champion pig," the commission report said.

Fagin was eventually brought into the judge's chambers, said the commission, whereupon she told him, "You've been a naughty boy."

TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY OFFICE OF THE DEAN OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS

To be eligible to purchase the Texas A&M ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one year in residence and credit for at least ninety-two (92) semester hours. A year in residence may consist of the fall and spring semesters or one of the above and a full summer session (both the first and second terms). The hours passed at the preliminary grade report period on March 12, 1975 may be used in satisfying this ninety-two-hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation should leave their names with the ring clerk, room seven, Richard Coke Building. This should be done prior to March 12th in order for all records to be checked to determine ring eligibility. Students already having ninety-two (92) completed hours on record may order at any time since regular orders are sent in at the end of each month. Graduate students are eligible to order with proof (receipt) that they have filed for graduation.

Orders for mid-semester will be taken by the ring clerk starting March 24, 1975 and will continue until May 1, 1975 at 4 p.m. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Students will save time if they bring grade reports along when ready to order. Students who fail to leave their names in advance will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked. The rings are due to arrive at the registrar's on June 17, 1975. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 24, 1975 or May 1, 1975, will arrive at the same time.

The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. of each week, Monday through Friday. However, in order for records to be checked, orders must be placed prior to 4 p.m. during this ordering period.
