State board race Albritton withdraws

BRYAN (AP) — Ford Albritton Jr., of Bryan, facing Texas Senate opposition, said Thursday he was asking Gov. Dolph Briscoe to withdraw his appointment to the Texas College Coordinating Board.

"Apparently there is enough opposition in the Senate to block my nomination. I do not think it will benefit the coordinating board or the State of Texas to have this motion debated in the state Senate. I am therefore asking the governor to withdraw my name," said Albritton. Albritton made his comments to the Bryan Eagle.

The appointees were cleared by the Senate Nominations Committee Tuesday after a long hearing in which several of them were questioned at length concerning their political affiliations and views on education.

The Austin American-Statesman

said Wednesday that "a nominations subcommittee source" said opposition was being rallied against Ford D. Albritton Jr. of Bryan, named to complete a six-year term that ends this Aug. 31.

Albritton told the nominations committee Tuesday he had contributed up to \$9,000 to the governor's last two campaigns but indicated he did not think there was any connection between the donations and his appointment.

The American-Statesman quoted Lt. Gov. Bill Hobby as saying, "I know he will be opposed. That's all I can tell you," about Albritton's appointment.

The story said Sen. Peyton McKnight, D-Tyler, who served four years on the Texas A&M University board with Albritton, was identified as the senator considering an effort to block confirmation. "I might oppose him and again I

may not be opposed to any of them," McKnight told the American-Statesman.

Appointments by the governor must be confirmed by two-thirds of the Senate, meaning 11 votes can block any appointment.

New appointees to the Coordinating Board are Mrs. Jess Hay of Dallas; Tony Bonilla of Corpus Christi and Harold Herndon of San Antonio.

Reappointments to the board are Fred Moore of Austin, O. H. Elliott of Austin and Dr. George Brinkley of Temple.

To be eligible to purchase the Texas A&M ring, an undergraduate student must have at least one year in residence and credit for at least ninety-two (92) semester hours. A year in residence may consist of the fall and spring semesters or one of the above and a full summer session (both the first and second terms). The hours passed at the preliminary grade report period on March 12, 1975 may be used in satisfying this ninety-two hour requirement. Students qualifying under this regulation should leave their names with the ring clerk, room seven, Richard Coke Building. This should be done prior to March 12th in order for all records to be checked to determine ring eligibility. Students already having ninety-two (92) completed hours on record may order at any time since regular orders are sent in at the end of each month. Graduate students are eligible to order with proof (receipt) that they have filed for graduation.

Orders for mid semester will be taken by the ring clerk starting March 24, 1975 and will continue until May 1, 1975 at 4 p.m. All rings must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Students will save time if they will bring grade reports along when ready to order. Students who fail to leave their names in advance will be asked to return later to allow time for records to be checked. The rings are due to arrive at the registrar's on June 17, 1975. All rings ordered, regardless of whether on March 24, 1975 or May 1, 1975, will arrive at the same time. The ring clerk is on duty from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. of each week, Monday through Friday. However, in order for records to be checked, orders must be placed prior to 4 p.m. during this ordering period.

Watergate inevitable, claims John Dean

WACO (AP) — If the Watergate scandal had not been uncovered, this nation would have faced another form of watergate someday far worse than the corruption of the Nixon presidency, John Dean III said Monday.

Dean, former White House counsel to Nixon who later helped bring the Watergate scandal into the open with his testimony before a

Senate committee, spoke to more than 2,000 students at Baylor University.

"It would be very nice to say I did what I did in loyalty to the president," Dean said. "But I also did the things I did during Watergate because I was looking out for John Dean. I was also ambitious and I got blinded by my own ambitions."

"I knew what pleased my superiors and I did my damndest to please them."

Dean said he certainly wasn't proud "to have prepared a memo on how to screw your enemies."

Dean recounted his involvement in the Watergate affair saying the scandal had been both the best and worst experience of his life.

"Certainly it was the worst experience of my life because of the grief it caused my family and the disgrace of Watergate is certainly not a pleasant situation. I don't look forward to wearing the scarlet letter of Watergate the rest of my life."

Dean said his going to prison for four months was not pleasant.

"It was not the country club I had read about in newspapers and magazines. I never saw the tennis courts."

Another bad experience, he said, was testifying about Watergate "because I knew it was going to tarnish the office of the presidency. It wasn't something I looked forward to."

On the positive side, he said, Watergate's "certainly was a maturing experience for me. It changed my perception and views of things. Sometimes it really takes something like that to really open your eyes although it shouldn't."

His perception of government changed because of Watergate, he noted.

"I began to ask myself what would have happened if I had left the White House and we had gotten away with the cover-up. I would have had a very distorted perception of what should and could be done in the name of the president of the United States."

"I also believe there would have been another Watergate someday and one far worse than this one."
