Phil Maxwell of the attorney general's environmental protection ivision said the federal suit will eek to prevent exemptions to the ederal Environmental Protection gency's (EPA) "no discharge"

The standard prevents the disharge of any sewage from a new essel after Jan. 30, 1977.

Maxwell said the U.S. Coast Guard, which is being sued along with the EPA and the Transportation Department, would exempt any new vessel that is equipped with a sanitation device by Jan. 30,

The nonaddictive alcoholic user has just a psychological dependence on alcohol and no true physical need. Many problem drinkers of this type still hold jobs, are married and usually don't appear sick to the general public.


