Monday there will be a question and answer session in room 226 of

the library for interested students and faculty to find out more about library policy and procedure. The session will begin at 11:30 a.m. and the panel of respondents will include Dr. Irene Hoadley, director of libraries, as well as other lib-

arians and administrators. An outdoor concert of folk music will be presented Tuesday from 11 a.m. till 2 p.m. Student performers will entertain from the steps outside the Library.

A 7 p.m. lecture Wednesday features Dr. W. R. Downs from the Johnson Space Center who looks toward the future and the space program's role in it. Downs will speak in room 226 of the library.

A book sale sponsored by the Friends of the Library will be held Thursday, beginning at 10 a.m. Everyone is asked to donate books, magazines, maps, sheet music, etc. by taking the items to drop boxes in the library (outside if the weather permits), or at McDonald's, or by calling Pam Walton in the Microtext Division at 845-1952.


