Rookies Marvin Barnes and Moses Malone have demonstrated in the toughest kind of competition in sports — the post-season playoffs — that they have indeed come of age as basketball pros.

"Now I feel as if I'm a seasoned pro," said Barnes after scoring 37 points, including 12 straight, as the Spirits of St. Louis beat the New York Nets 115-97 Wednesday nights and evened the best-of-seven American Basketball Association series at 1-1.

"I'd say it's fair to say he's really grown up in basketball in the past couple of weaks," said Utah Coach Tom Nissalk after Malone scored 30 points and grabbed a team-record 33 rebounds in giving the Stars a 122-108 victory over Denver and cutting the Nuggets' margin to 2-1 in another ABA playoff set.

Barnes and Malone return to action Friday night when New York is at St. Louis and Denver is at Utah. Barnes, the ABA Rookie of the Year, credited experience and a burg, Va.
