Metcalf signs Swanson on cage letter-of-intent

Editor's Note: Watch Batt for four games for a 37.3 average. interview with Swanson this week.

Lyndon Swanson, a 6-8 forwardcenter from Martinton, Ill., has signed a basketball letter-of-intent with Texas A&M, according to coach Shelby Metcalf.

Swanson, who was named to the all-state team by both the Chicago Tribune and Chicago Daily News, was contacted by more than 150 colleges. He narrowed his choices down to A&M and Memphis State before signing with the Aggies.

'Swanson's the best big man shooter I've seen since John Beasley," A&M assistant coach Norman Reuther said. "He has all the qualities you are looking for - character, intelligence, competitiveness and ability. We're extremely pleased that he chose A&M."

Swanson led Watseka High School to third place in the Illinois State Tournament in which he was the leading scorer and rebounder. This season he averaged 30 points per game while shooting 53 percent from the field and 80 percent from the free throw line.

In 88 career games, Swanson scored in double figures 83 times and had more than 20 points 63 times. He is in the top quarter of his class, was all-state in football, played pitcher and firstbase in baseball, and threw the shot and discus in track.

Swanson's list of honors is long. He made all-county, all-conference and all-area for three years. He was named to the 50-year Golden Anniversary team in Iroquois County and the Associated Press all-state tournament team. He set five records in the big Danville Holiday Tournament including 149 points in

"He is very strong fundamen-

tally," Reuther said. "His coach Keith Baldwin has done a fine job.'


