Team visits Waco Saturday Brodhead wins 220 at Relays



Brodhead, who was the high point man in the Southwest Conference meet last year, also took sixth in the 100-yard dash with a 9.7. He qualified for the conference meet in both the 220 and 100. His 220 time qualified him for nationals.

Distance man Bruce Smith "ran great" according to Head Track Coach Charles Thomas. Smith captured the three mile run with a 14.08.0 clocking, A&M's best mark in that race this year. Charles Cottle dropped his three mile time from 14.51.0 to 14.19.1, much to Thomas' satisfaction. Taking second in the javelin was






Brown gets 1975 Coach of Year title

NEW YORK (AP) - Larry Brown, who led the Denver Nugyoung man and his recovery. Our gets from last place to the best record in pro basketball, was named the American Basketball Association's Coach of the Year for the 1974-75 season Monday.

Brown, a former star playmaker in the ABA, received 28½ votes of a possible 30 in balloting by sports writers and broadcasters in each of the league's 10 franchise cities. Bob Leonard of the Indiana Pacers collected the remaining 11/2 votes.

Brown is the first coach in the eight-year history of the ABA to earn Coach of the Year honors twice. He first received the award in the 1972-73 season for guiding the Carolina Cougars to the Eastern Division championship. "Obviously I'm thrilled," Brown
