**Senate**

**SG to hold orientation**

Because of the Judicial Board injunction prohibiting the Student Senate to transact any official business, a group consisting mainly of senators will meet Wednesday night at 7:30 p.m. in room 204 of the Harrington Center.

Consisting of general information and orientation for new senators, the meeting will feature introductions of the Student Government Executive Committee who will explain

the purpose and functions of their various committees: Finance, Rules and Regulations, Academic Affairs, External Affairs and Student Services.

The manner in which a resolution should be discussed, debated, passed or failed will also be discussed at the meeting.

Information about two new bills will also be distributed to senate members.

The first proposal concerns the

operation of student government during the summer, defining guidelines as to what action the Student Body President can take during this time.

The other bill will request an open-air radio facility such as KORA-FM to broadcast SG radio.

The resolution would allocate a \$1200 loan to student radio from the refrigerator fund for June, 1975.

**GI tutorial benefits**

Dependents of deceased or totally disabled veterans are eligible for the recently increased tutorial assistance benefits.

The expanded GI Bill boosted benefits to \$720 per year for accredited tutorial assistance.

Students must report the number of individualized tutoring sessions and return the claim within one year of the school year division in which the assistance was furnished.

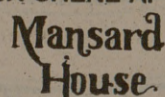

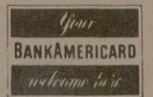
