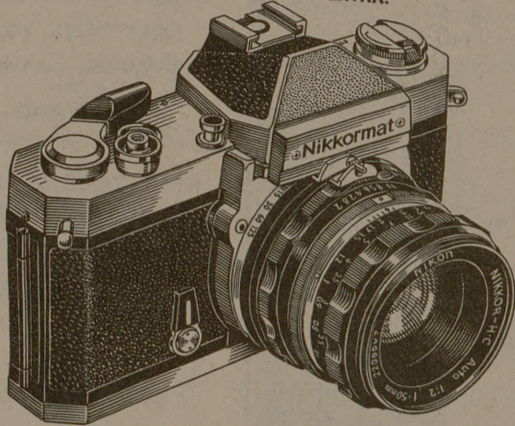

## Wilt sponsors fem track club

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Wilt Chamberlain has tried to meld into the masses as just another citizen, avoiding as much publicity as a 7-foot-1 former National Basketball Association star can. But there's one place he often can be found — at track meets where Wilt's Wonder Women compete.

Although he won't talk about his days as an NBA star because, according to his attorney, he "answered so many dumb questions," he loved to talk about track and the team he sponsors.

"Track has always been my No. 1 sport, but it didn't take me long to realize I couldn't make as much money in track as I could in basket-

ball," he said recently.

"My club is the old La Jolla Track Club which went out of business," said Chamberlain. "My goal is to give these girls and women a chance to compete on a level where they can prepare for the Olympics if they want."

"I first realized there was a problem with women's track back when I was in high school. I competed at the Penn Relays one year, and when I got there I realized there were no female events. Well, my sister Barbara, when we were in high school, was a great athlete.

"She was a sprinter and very fast, I think she could have been another Wilma Rudolph, but there was no place for her to compete, so she never developed like she could have."

"She might have been as great an athlete as I was," Chamberlain then waxed philosophic: "Here in America, there is a lack of equality in race, in sex and in sports, too. I don't think there's been enough equality in the area of women's track especially."

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Philadelphia Phillies owner Ruly Carpenter said Monday he will continue to make every effort possible to get controversial slugger Dick Allen from the Atlanta Braves.

Carpenter, however, did not hold much hope that the two teams could reach agreement, saying there is about "one chance in 10" Philadelphia will land Allen.

And the Phillies chief executive discounted the theory that Sunday's trade of Willie Montanez for Garry Maddox of the San Francisco Giants has anything to do with negotiations for Allen.

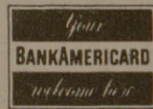
