Intramurals suffer participation lag

Did everybody know there was still an intramural program going on during the summer? Apparently not, because out of approximately 8,000 students enrolled for the first summer session, only about 576 people are participating in intramural sports, according to Susan Schleider, assistant director for the intramural program, and included in the 576 participants are faculty and staff members.

Both summer sessions include slow-pitch softball, three-man volleyball, three-man basketball, and racketball, tennis, and handball singles and doubles.

Of all the sports offered this summer, so far softball has been the leading game — drawing in 312 participants in the first summer session. Three-man basketball has 65 participants and 130 participations for this session.

It's too late to sign up for the first summer session, but there's only 10 more days anyway so if any of these sports interest you, the intramural office will begin taking entries for the second session July 9-14.

Off-campus students, on-campus students, women, men, faculty and staff can sign up for as many sports as they want to play. The only problem with signing up for more than one sport is the schedule clash.

Last year the intramural program grew to an all time high in participation. The 45 to 50 per cent increase caused problems in the program.

For one thing, last year's budget was \$70,000 per year. That was supposed to take care of all the program's expenses (facility upkeep, salaries, equipment, officials) — and left \$3.33 per person enrolled which isn't enough to make the program work to its fullest potential.

The budget request for the 75-76 year was \$170,000. This raise would increase the expenditure from \$3.33 per person to \$7.73 per person.

The new budget for the fall will make able some things that the program has done without in the past years. With the budget increase and the expected participation next year, new things will be added to the intramural program.

First of all, I was told that basically the majority of the budget had been spent by May. The summer program will cause a dip into next year's budget, because there is not much money left in the budget from last year.

So it seems that in the fall one of the first things the new budget will be spent on will be paying for the summer sessions. Some of the new additions to the program will be a new assistant director who will be directly involved with the sports, a new softball field across the railroad tracks, more officials who are qualified to referee the games so that more games can be played, new equipment, an increase of the staff, a co-recreational program, and more supervision in the areas of campus facilities so they don't have to close at 5:00 anymore.

Ali says he'll quit after bout

At a news conference Monday Muhammad Ali said, "I'm 99 per cent sure I'll retire." And at a news conference Tuesday he said that he intended to make his July 1 title defense against Joe Bugner his last fight. But he also added that there's some pressure on him to fight Joe Frazier once more.

"That's the only thing that's giving me any trouble," Ali said. "I've already gotten telegrams from people saying I have to fight Joe Frazier again (each man has won one fight against the other)."

If Ali changes his mind about quitting and meets Frazier, it probably won't be in October as planned. He said he would begin filming a story about his life Oct. 10 entitled "The Greatest."

Ali said he wanted to spend more time with his wife, children, make movies, lecture and become more involved in the Nation of Islam, also known as the Black Muslims.

Also, he said he would like to quit when he's on top as did such athletes as the late Rocky Marciano, the undefeated heavyweight champion, and football star Jim Brown.

"Too many fighters have quit before I'm starting to get hurt more, and I'm gonna have to fall soon," said the 33-year-old Ali who has lost twice against 47 victories as a pro.

Ali's announcement can decrease or increase the pressure on him, just as other aspects like humidity, heat, and age will bring the pressure in.

The age of Bugner is one of those interesting aspects about youth vs. age. Bugner is 25.

In what will be his 50th pro fight, Ali is favored 5-2.

SA tanker signs A&M scholarship
