McGrath was named Outstanding Sports Writer last year at the Student Publications end-of-school banquet.



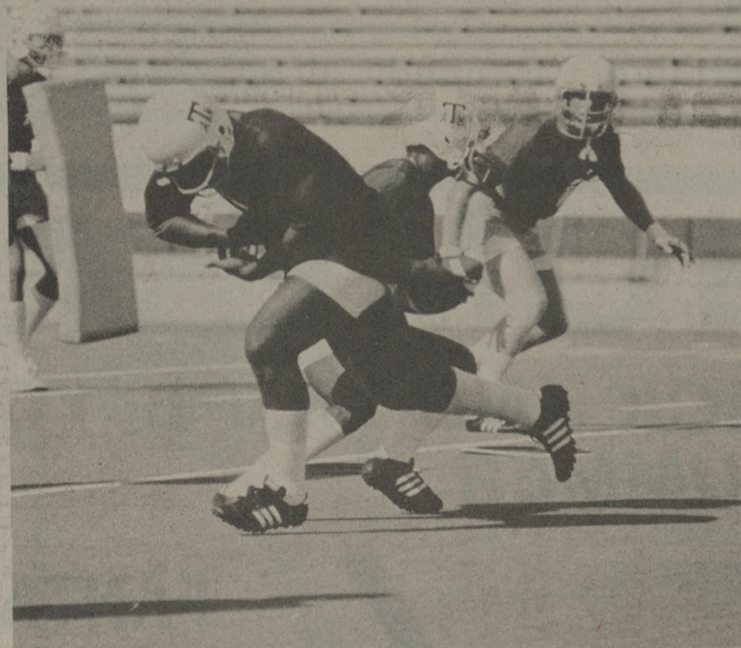
