

She took top honors in the city tournament there in '71, '73, and '74. She was low-amateur at the LPGA's Alamo Classic in 1974.

Brenda was Junior Medalist in Texas in '70, '71, and '72 and Medalist in the State Publinx in collegiate competition, as were the 1971.
