



Top women's golfer Goldsmith not farce

There are presently a few people here at Aggieland who insist on clinging to tradition, and still think that the Athletic Department for Women is a farce.

Or perhaps the idea comes just a hair too near to their pocketbook? Some of them know the basketball team as some strange thing that they came upon when they arrived early at the men's games. They were even "kinda good." Still, fewer know that the softball team is second in the state. And the swimmers are fast, believe it or not.

Brenda Goldsmith is no farce. She is on a golf scholarship at this

very college. Her handicap is one and her lowest score is 68, with which she won the San Antonio Women's City Title with in 1973. If you still think it's a farce, well, read on.

Brenda began to play golf, at her father's suggestion when she was 12. He passed her talents on to a pro, Harold Blaylock. Her coach at A&M is Kitty Holly, and she answered, "Everything," when asked what she expected of Brenda this year.

Brenda is an Agronomy major, who spends her leisure time raising Doberman puppies, breaking her '59 Chevy, shooting pool, and playing a bit of tennis. This year she

wants "to really concentrate on playing a lot of collegiate golf. I've set my sight on the National Championship."

Brenda began playing golf in competition while at MacArthur High School in San Antonio, where she won the first high school level tournament ever held for girls in the State of Texas. She took top honors in the city tournament there in '71, '73, and '74. She was low-amateur at the LPCA's Alamo Classic in 1974.

Brenda was Junior Medalist in Texas in '70, '71, and '72 and Medalist in the State Publix in 1971. In national competition she has made her mark when she was a semi-finalist in '73 and '74 in the

Western Classic and a semi-finalist in the Southern Classic in '74 and '75. She tied for 25th in the Women's U.S. Open in 1973. The Mexican Amateur has her as sixth in 1973. All of this together probably gave her the ranking of number 1 Junior in the United States in 1973.

While on tour this last year she became one of the first women to play on the Scottish course when she qualified for the British Amateur. She won the Lady Cardinal at Lamar Tech. That win was in collegiate competition, as were the two second places she won at the University of Arkansas Open and in the State Tournament at Lubbock.

Students get in free with an A&M ID card, faculty and staff members are \$1 per entry. Student family passes are \$10 and other family passes are \$15. Single member passes are \$10.

Tennis courts are open 4 p.m. to midnight Monday through Friday, and 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Reservations for handball and tennis courts may be made through the intramural office by coming by or calling 845-2624 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. After 4 p.m. reservations for handball courts can be made in DeWare Fieldhouse. Tennis court reservations after 4 p.m. can be made at the tennis courts.

Equipment for recreational use may be checked out with an A&M ID at the Intramural office between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., in DeWare Field-

house between 4 p.m. and 10 p.m. A current A&M ID card is required to use recreational facilities, and each student or staff member is allowed one guest.


