Ruggers lose to SHSU

The Texas A&M football team wasn't the only Aggie team to open its season Saturday.

The A&M rugby team opened against the Sam Houston State University rugby team and won one, lost one and tied one in the three games that were played.

The Aggie A-team lost by a score of 11-0. The Aggie B-team won 14-0 and the C-team tied 4-4.

In the A contest Hillard Simmons played an outstanding scrum half. He won 17 and lost 10 scrums in a

game which saw the Aggies trail 0-7 at the half.

Faculty representative Gerard O'Donovan said that the Aggie play was good for the first game of the season. "Our passing was outstanding."

"John Rayton did a good job at center, directing the traffic among the backs. He was a star for a few years around here," O'Donovan said, "when Roger Boos was coach."

O'Donovan also praised Tim Fields who played an excellent game as fullback but sat out the second half with shin splints. He was replaced by Bruce Mills.

"Everyone on the Aggie team played their best," O'Donovan added. "I think John Lipscomb has won a place in the front row. He was pushed by second row man Jeff Warren."

The Aggie second team won its game 14-0. "On paper and on the field the second team looked better than the first," O'Donovan said.

Alan Jeffrey played his first game after coming to A&M to work on his Ph.D. in the Oceanography Department. He played fullback and did a good job.

Another standout for the Ags was Butch Lewis who won 20 of 25 scrums and scored the opening try for four points. The two point conversion failed.

Mark Wagner made the second Aggie score after some fancy passing. Alan Jeffrey made the final conversion after a great run for a try by John Wycle.

Unlike the first team the second team won 80 percent of the line outs.

The third game ended in a 4-4 tie. "The purpose of that game was to show that everyone who goes on rugby and stays out will play, but won't stand on the sidelines," O'Donovan said.

O'Donovan added that anyone interested in going out for rugby should contact him or playmate John Rayton. "We will be looking for different players at different positions throughout the first semester so we invite anyone who wants to get out to feel free to come on," O'Donovan said.
