

Aggie frosh beat Consol for title

The Texas A&M Water Polo team hosted a high school tournament at the Down Natatorium here last Friday and Saturday. Larry Scheckler has done quite a job in his first year of coaching, as he guided the Frosh 'A' team to six wins in the tournament. The Frosh 'B' team won 1 and lost 3 in the tourney.

The 'A' team reached the finals by handing out sound whippings to

Wichita Falls, Clear Creek, McAllen High, Alamo Heights High and Lamarque High, who were last year's 4-A State Champions. The freshmen met A&M Consolidated in the finals. Bill Yates scored 4 goals and Paul Stewart 5, to lead their team to a 1-3 win over Consol.

The 'A' team completely dominated their opponents by outscoring them 85-11. The high scorers for A&M in the tourney were: Bill Kuvlesky, 14 goals, David Stewart and

Paul Gill, 13 goals each, and Roger Lieu, 11 goals.

Vincent Tavaroz of McAllen was voted the most valuable player of

the tournament. From A&M, Roger Lieu, Bill Yates, and Scott Harris, goalie, were named to the first All-Tournament team. Paul Gill, Brad

Swendig, Bill Kuvlesky, and David Stewart were named to the second team.

A&M's Frosh 'A' team was first in

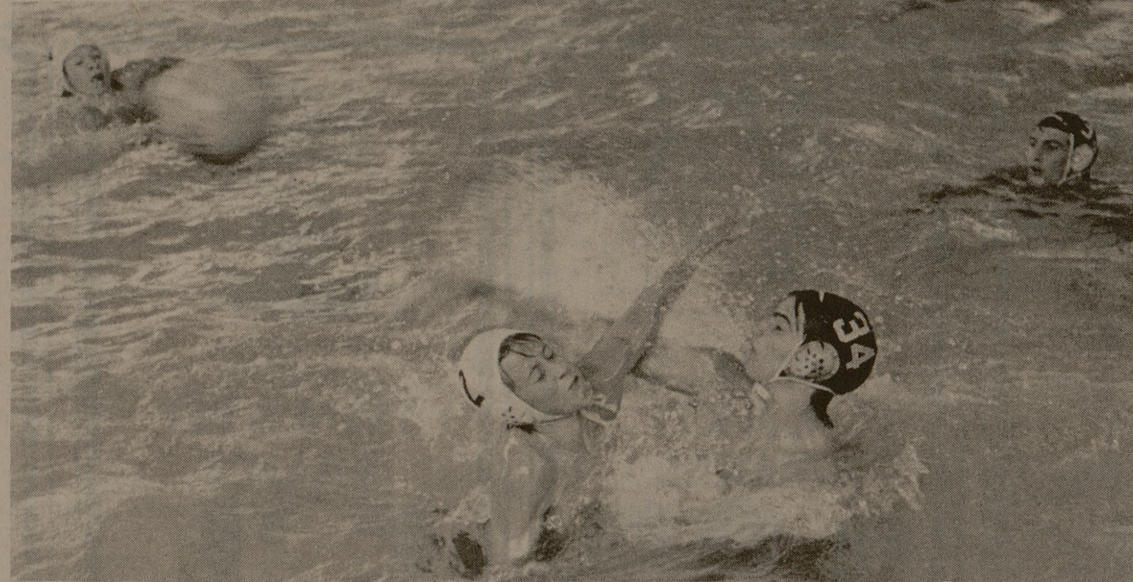
total tournament standings, with A&M Consolidated second, and Lamarque High third.

Dennis Fosdick is the head swimming coach, and he will be moving Bill Yates to the varsity. He said Yates held back in most of the games, but played all out in the finals. Roger Lieu and David Stewart will be moved up also.

Fosdick thought Scott Harris played well in the goal. "He was All-State as a field player last year,

and is still learning the goalie position." He said Kuvlesky, a former Consolidated player, is doing well. "He was used to a one-man offense at Consolidated and is just now learning our system."

New players on the team are: Phil Pellegrino, Paul Gill, Chris Shipp, Brad Swendig, Jim Leugemors, and Chuck Burr. Fosdick says they have never played water polo before and are learning quickly and doing quite well.

Ags drop to 11th in poll

Penn State, Texas and Tennessee were the big gainers in this week's Associated Press college football poll while Auburn, Michigan State, Maryland and North Carolina State dropped out of the Top Twenty.

Penn State climbed to seventh place from 10th by whipping Stanford 34-14 while Texas and Tennessee joined the Top Ten for the first time this season. Texas, 12th a week ago, moved up to eighth by trouncing Colorado State 46-0 while Tennessee jumped to 10th from 20th with a 26-8 triumph over Maryland,

which had been 14th.

Oklahoma was still in the top spot with a 62-7 rout of Oregon. The defending national champion Sooners received 53 first-place votes and 1,130 of a possible 1,140 points from a nation-wide panel of 57 sports writers and broadcasters.

Also repeating from last week in the second through sixth spots were Michigan, Ohio State, Southern California, Missouri and Nebraska.

Michigan received two first-place votes and 931 points following a 23-6 whipping of Wisconsin. Ohio State, a 21-0 winner over Michigan State, got the other two first-place ballots and 922 points. Southern Cal trimmed Duke 35-7 and polled 685 points, idle Missouri received 632 and Nebraska totaled 478 after a 10-7 victory over Louisiana State.

Notre Dame, which opened its season with a nationally televised 17-3 decision over Boston College Monday night, held onto ninth place with 392 points.

The AP's Second Ten announced Tuesday consists of Texas A&M, UCLA, Florida, Alabama, Pitt, Arkansas, Arizona, Arizona State, Miami of Ohio and West Virginia. Last week, it was Michigan State,

Texas, Alabama, Maryland, N.C. State, UCLA, Arizona, Pitt, Florida and Tennessee.

Auburn was upset by Memphis State 31-20, Texas A&M fell to 11th from eighth with a hard-fought 7-0 triumph over winless Mississippi and N.C. State was kayoed by Wake Forest 30-22.

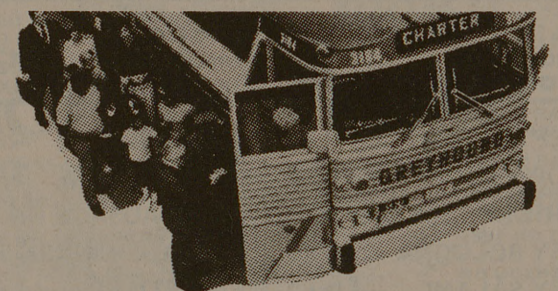

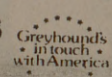
