Defeat Frisco 14-3

Tankers successful in opener

Amidst the confusion of rule changes, the Texas A&M water polo team was successful in its first test on the West Coast, blasting San Francisco State University 14-3.

Coach Dennis Fosdick's tankers made good their first day in California, an annual trek for the Aggie poloists. "When we get off the plane like this we're usually sluggish. This is the best first game we've ever had out here," said Fosdick.

Freshman Blake Hinman led the Aggie scoring with four goals. Bob Leland and the Yates brothers, Jim and Bill, contributed two scores to the A&M cause. Doug Adamson and Oran Marksbury had a goal apiece.

Marksbury was the high assist man with four while Bill Yates and captain Lee Davis each had a pair.

Steve Engel continued to do a good job in goal despite a shortage of practice time, blocking three of six San Francisco shots.

"Jim Yates played well, he had a real good game for us," Fosdick said about the senior. "Marksbury (a second year man) played perhaps his best game ever."

As for the entire team's performance, Fosdick said, "We're working better as a team, although we did have some sloppy passes. We're not keeping the area in front of the goal open enough."

"We've got people now who can handle the ball real well," said the Aggie mentor. He said this factor en-

ables A&M to sit at the post and fire away at the goal instead of having to drive all of the time and taking a majority of shots off the fast break.

The rule changes were only minor according to Fosdick. The NCAA is now adopting the rules for international style of play.

Previously, team fouls were totaled and after a certain amount of penalty shot could be taken or after five personal fouls a player could be temporarily or permanently ejected.

Now the five foul rule is out al-

though a player can still be thrown out for three penalty shot-type fouls or for pulling someone back. Players can also be sent to the showers for fouls during the three-second dead time periods which occur throughout the game.

"It's a much faster game with these new rules which is better for us. It keeps our players moving which is to our advantage," Fosdick said.

The rules apply only to four-year schools as "as far as we know" said Fosdick, would be kept through the

remainder of the season.

A&M is now 4-0 for the year and faces a tough doubleheader tonight against West Valley and College of Sequoia.

The Aggies' 12 man travel squad will really be put through the grinder come Friday as they have three on tests. "That takes a lot of swimming but we're in super shape now so I don't think it will hurt us," views the Aggie Coach.

A&M will return from the California trek Sunday.

The situation centers around the fact that Grambling University scheduled both Prairie View and Oregon State on the same date. Al-

though the scheduled Dallas Cotton Bowl game between Prairie View and Grambling is the official Southwestern Athletic Conference scheduled date for both teams, Grambling however, as of this date has refused to play the game.

Prairie View officials stated that the matter has been submitted to the Texas A&M System attorney and possibly end up in litigation.
