Ohio State perched comfortably atop the college football ratings Monday while Oklahoma's defending national champions plummeted from second place to sixth following a 23-3 upset at the hands of Kansas.

By beating Oklahoma the Jayhawks cracked the Top Twenty for the first time all season, rising to 17th place.

Meanwhile, Nebraska and Texas A&M, unbeaten and untied like Ohio State received 49 first-place votes and 1,138 points from a nationwide panel of 58 sports writ-ers and broadcasters following a 40-3 triumph over Illinois. Here are the Top Twenty teams
