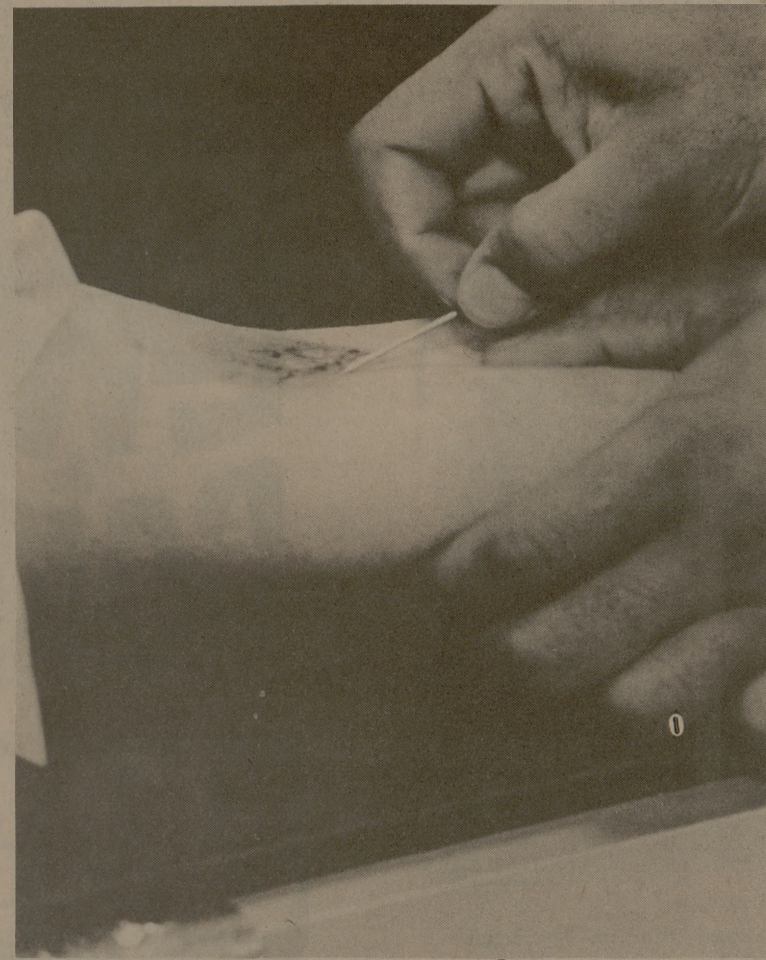

## Rabbi says no one wants doctors to decide life or death

DALLAS — No one wants just doctors to be the final persons to decide on life or death in situations such as the Karen Quinlan case, a New York rabbi has told the Union of American Hebrew Congregations meeting here.

Vernon, N. Y., said Tuesday that "decision groups" should have the responsibility of making such decisions. The decision groups would represent physicians, the family and society in determining what action should be taken in life-or-death situations.

Dr. Perman told a special session on "Bio-Medical Ethics" at the 53rd Assembly of the UAHC that "the New Jersey Superior Court decision is only the first step in the evolution of a new social attitude toward resolving one of our most vexing problems."

He was referring to Judge Robert Muir's decision Monday stating that Karen Ann Quinlan, who has been in a coma for the past seven months, must be kept alive by mechanical life-supporting means. The judge ruled that the decision to turn off the machines rests with doctors and not with the parents or the church.

"What justification is there to remove it (the decision) from the control of the medical profession and place it in the hands of the courts?" the judge asked.

Rabbi Perman, member of the Human Rights Subjects Review Committee of the Mt. Sinai School of Medicine, said the judge's decision "extends beyond the scope of our present legislation."

He said the Karen Quinlan case has "uniquely brought the spheres of law, religion, ethics, and medicine together. It literally forced the disciplines to speak to each other. Even more significant is that such decisions have been brought out into the open, away from the isolation of hospital corridors and waiting rooms."

## 2 Cuban MIG 21's harass U.S. plane

WASHINGTON — Two Cuban MIG21 jet fighters harassed an unarmed U.S. Coast Guard plane searching for a disabled pleasure boat in international waters more than two weeks ago, U.S. officials say.

The Coast Guard confirmed a Pentagon report of the MIG intercept, which forced the HU 16 amphibian plane to break off its search for the boat. No shots were fired, and the pleasure boat with two persons aboard was found later, a spokesman said.

Asked why the Oct. 26 episode was not announced, the Coast Guard spokesman said a local Coast Guard commander viewed it as "an isolated incident not worthy of release."

The State Department was notified of the incident but kept silent about it.

Officials said there was an exchange of diplomatic notes with the Cubans, but no protest. They said the U.S. note explained the mission of the Coast Guard search and rescue aircraft. The contents of the Cuban note were not disclosed.

According to a report which circulated in the Pentagon, the Coast Guard plane was intercepted by the two Russian-built MIGs about 40 miles northwest of the Cuban coast.

The account said the MIGs made numerous passes across the nose of the U.S. plane and wagged their wings in a "follow me" signal, indicating the Cuban pilots wanted the U.S. plane to land in Cuba.

However, the seaplane was said to have headed back to its base in Miami, Fla., and the MIGs flew away.

A Coast Guard spokesman said

the search plane's crew had not spotted the drifting boat before being intercepted by the MIGs. The amphibian refueled at its Miami station, went out again and located the 35-foot boat about 48 miles northwest of Dimas, Cuba. A Coast Guard cutter then towed the boat to Key West, Fla., the spokesman said.

The Pentagon report said the Coast Guard plane never came closer than 15 nautical miles to the Cuban coast. Cuba claims territorial waters extending three miles, it said.

PRESENTS HOW TO WIN AT **Pong**

- You can sometimes control the direction of the ball by where it hits your paddle. If it hits the center it will go straight. If it hits the right edge, it will go right, etc. Flicking the paddle to get a spin might work but is less controlled.
- Avoid the sharp angle shots since they tend to slow the ball and are easy to return. The most effective angle shots are those that rebound closest to your opponent, the deadliest being the shot that rebounds just as it hits his line of play.
- Shots down the middle are boring and slow. However, late in the rally after the ball has speeded up, a middle shot can be a killer if used deliberately to surprise your opponent.
