Aggies went through the pre-conference schedule with a 7-3 mark that included two strong per-formances in losses to nationally ranked Louisville and San Francisco. The Aggies begin Southwest Conference play Saturday against Baylor

in Waco.
"More than anything we needed the experience of playing some tough teams on the road, and we got it," said Aggie assistant coach Nor-

man Reuther.
"We played some highly rated teams and should have won. We out-played Louisville and they won it at the free throw line," Reuther said. Louisville had 34 free throws to 12 for the Aggies. "We also had a good game against San Francisco and should have won it, but we didn't," Reuther added.
