Chairmanships open for MSC committee

The MSC Council and Directorate is now accepting applications for the chairmanships of all Student Programs Office (SPO) committees. The committees include such organizations as Aggie Cinema, Cepheid Variable, Great Issues, SCONA and Political Forum, which are the sponsors of almost every speaker and movie presented on campus.

John Nelson, vice-president of administration on the council, said that any student may apply who has a 2.4 GPR even if he has no previous committee experience.

"The 2.4 GPR requirement has been waived on occasion," Nelson added.

Committee chairmen are responsible for appointing the committee's other officers and coordinating activities through the MSC Council and Directorate.

Students may apply for the chair-

manship of more than one committee if they wish.

Applications may be picked up in the Student Programs Office, MSC 216. Applications are due by 5:00 p.m., Monday, February 9.

Cepheid Variable

The science fiction and fantasy committee presents science fiction films and a course on science fiction writing. Each spring the club organizes a science fiction convention, AggieCon.

Free University

Free U offers students and the community a chance to learn about subjects not available in the University's academic curriculum.

Great Issues

This committee presents a series of speakers dealing with one subject area per semester.

OPAS

The Opera and Performing Arts Society has been a subcommittee of Town Hall but will be a separate MSC committee this spring. It is responsible for the public relations, publicity, hosting and ushering at concerts, ballets and other functions.

Host and Fashion

This organization provides and teaches members hosting, tours, food and fashion consciousness.

Basement

The Basement Committee provides inexpensive entertainment for students in the form of folk and progressive country music. Basement performances include open air and noon hour concerts as well as presentations in the Basement coffeehouse.

Black Awareness

The committee programs featured on black culture and history.

Camera

The photography club provides students with black and white as well as color darkrooms, instructions in photography and contests. During the spring the club sponsors an Inter-collegiate Photo Salon.

Outdoor Recreation

This committee organizes trips and trains members in the skills necessary for survival in the wilds as well as proper care and maintenance of equipment.

Political Forum

Political Forum is a non-partisan organization which brings speakers to the campus to talk on issues of current international, national, and state politics.

Radio

The Radio Committee conducts classes to help students "ham" licenses and is active in handling, emergency communications, radio teletype and communications satellites.

Recreation

This committee coordinates sub-areas of union games, one-shot programs.

SCONA

The Student Conference on National Affairs sponsors an afternoon which brings together government officials, well-known figures, faculty members and students for a three and one-half day symposium on national and international issues.

Town Hall

This committee organizes and promotes live entertainment A&M.

Travel

The Travel Committee promotes and promotes low-cost trips for students, faculty and staff.

Video Tape

John Oeffinger has been named president of the MSC Council and Directorate for 1976-77. The announcement came after a closed session of the MSC Nominating Committee last night. Oeffinger is presently chairman of Political Forum.

The Opera and Performing Arts Society (OPAS) received full committee status upon approval of the Council. OPAS has been part of Town Hall since its creation three years ago. Programming and financial details for the committee will be handled as they have been in the past.

The Council also approved budget increases for two MSC committees, Basement and Cepheid Variable. Cepheid Variable received a \$900 increase in its budget for the remainder of the academic year.
